



A Brief History

◇ What is now Brand Library was built in 1904 as Leslie C. Brand's home, *Miradero*, "a high place overlooking a wide view." Built by Brand's nephew, architect Nathaniel Dryden, it was inspired by the East Indian Pavilion and built for the 1893 Columbian World Exposition held in Chicago.

◇ On April 10, 1925 Brand died, leaving his estate to the city of Glendale upon the death of his wife, provided it be converted into a public library and park. Mrs. Brand died in 1945. By 1956, the mansion had been converted into a 5,000 sq. ft. library.

◇ In 1969, an addition, a modernized version of the original Saracenic design, added 21,000 sq. ft. to the facility. The addition includes an art gallery, a recital hall, a sculpture court, and Brand Studios. This addition was built as "the cultural showplace of Glendale," a role it plays to this day.

◇ Born in Missouri in 1859, he became the sole provider for his family at age 11. In 1886, Brand came to California to take advantage of its first boom period.

◇ Mr. Brand is largely responsible for Glendale's civic development: he organized utility companies, founded the Title Guarantee and Trust Company, sponsored local businesses, invested heavily in San Fernando Valley real estate, and built a private airstrip where he hosted the world's first fly-in parties.

◇ He is called "The Father of Glendale" because he connected the city to the world by building its first electric railroad. He also relocated the city center to what is now Brand Boulevard.

Brand Park

This beautiful 31-acre park nestled at the base of the Verdugo mountains has hiking and biking trails, a Japanese garden, and a baseball / softball field. In addition, we have picnic areas which provide a relaxing setting for an afternoon outing. There is a playground and a wading pool that is operated in the summer season. Brand Park is also home to the Miss American Green Cross statue, a monument to the environmental movement. While hiking, look for the Brand Family Cemetery marked by a pyramid where the family is buried along with their dogs, at Mr. Brand's request.

Japanese Tea House

Given the name "Shoseian" or "Whispering Pine Teahouse," this traditional tea house was built in 1974 through combined efforts of the Sister Cities of Glendale and Higashi-Osaka, Japan. The garden and koi pond are open to the public daily. For information, call (818) 548-2752



Life-Long Learning Classes



Classes are offered through our life-long learning program for a fee for individuals of all ages. We offer classes in visual arts, such as watercolor, oil painting, life drawing and mixed media. Doctor's House

Built in 1888 at 921 E. Wilson Avenue, the Victorian house was restored and relocated to Brand Park in 1979. Tours of the interior are offered every Sunday from 2:00 - 4:00pm by docents of the Glendale Historical Society. For information, call (323) 251-9697



Wedding Reservations

The Japanese Friendship Garden and Gazebo are very popular locations for weddings, receptions and bridal photo sessions. Call the Customer Service Office at (818) 548-2184 to inquire about reservation information.

Fees: \$120/hour plus a \$100 conditionally refundable deposit

Photography Permits

Photography permits are available through the Brand Park Studios. Fees are as follows:

Brand Friendship Garden & Gazebo

Fee: \$235 for a 2 hr permit

Reservation includes exclusive use of the entire garden area including the outside of the Doctor's House.

Brand Library/Park Entrance

Fee: \$30 for a 1/2 hr permit

Reservation includes access to the park entrance of the Brand Library during non-operating hours.
