Description of Services

HOUSING DEVELOPMENT AND PRESERVATION - 18.3 % of Operating Budget

Administers affordable housing programs including rehabilitation assistance and programs to expand home ownership programs.

SECTION 8 RENTAL ASSISTANCE - 27.8 % of Operating Budget

Oversees Section 8 Rental Assistance Program for lower-income families, the disabled and senior citizens. The Assistance program is funded entirely by the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) - 17.8 % of Operating Budget

Administers federal funds targeted to meet the needs of low to moderate-income persons, including special needs populations such as at-risk youth, the elderly and the homeless. Helps revitalize neighborhoods in lower-income areas, administers Emergency Shelter Funds and pays for Social Service Programs.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT AND PRESERVATION - 29.6 % of Operating Budget

Administers federal employment education and training funds on behalf of Glendale, Burbank and La Cañada-Flintridge.

NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES - 6.3 % of Operating Budget

Provides programs and services that improve the environment and quality of life in Glendale's neighborhoods, including Code enforcement, community outreach and youth employment opportunities; responsible for removing graffiti in the City.
