 Glendale will hold its biennial Municipal Election April 5. And we need your help to make sure we have a good turnout! Remember there are many reasons or issues that drive people to vote, but there is not a single reason why you shouldn't, especially since there are so many easy ways to do so.

If you normally vote from home and have requested a ballot before the March 29th deadline but have not received it, you may contact our offices by phone or visit us at the **Election Center at 131 N. Isabel Street in the Glendale Police Department Community Room** to request a ballot in person. If you missed the March 29th deadline, you may request an **emergency ballot in person** or vote at the polls on Election Day from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Foothill Boulevard to Receive New Surface

The Glendale Public Works Department  has contracted for the resurfacing of Foothill Boulevard from Lowell Avenue to Pennsylvania Avenue beginning **April 6** and ending **April 29**. The material used will be “slurry seal,” a mixture of emulsified asphalt oil, rock, water, Portland cement and other additives. It's used as a treatment on residential driveways, public roads and highways, and provides for highly durable, low-cost paving and surface maintenance.

The seal will be applied one lane a time, leaving a minimum of one lane always open on each side of the street. Access to driveways for businesses will be available prior to—and four hours after—the slurry application. Driveways will be closed during the actual work itself. Please do not drive through the wet slurry, which could result in damage to car tires and to the surface, thus necessitating another application and extending the work schedule.

Glendale Gains New Businesses in its “Creative Corridor”

 Glendale’s “Creative Corridor” got a shot in the arm with the recent announcement that Technicolor Film Labs, Kinetic Lighting and Rough Draft Studios will all open new facilities. The 750 acre industrially-zoned section of the San Fernando Road Corridor is fast becoming a hub for the region’s entertainment industry. DreamWorks, KABC TV and several divisions of the Walt Disney Company are currently headquartered within its boundaries.


Technicolor will relocate its new film laboratory to 1763 Flower Street. Approximately 100 employees will be transferred to the new facility where 35 and 70 millimeter film will be processed and shipped to theaters and film producers worldwide.

Kinetic Lighting recently moved to Glendale from North Hollywood after a long search for a suitable building that would meet their long-term needs. The company contacted the City’s Economic Development Division who helped them locate a building at 722 Thompson, adjacent to the new Technicolor facility.

Rough Draft Studios also plans to relocate from Brand Boulevard to 615 Allen Avenue, in the same vicinity as Technicolor and Kinetic Lighting. The animation company has operated in Glendale since 1995.
