MESSAGE FROM SCOTT OCHOA



Glendale City Manager

With the State of California's dissolution of redevelopment agencies, many communities are confronting the harsh reality that local governments' primary economic development tool has been stripped away-just when we need all available tools to claw our way out of the Great Recession. Erasing decades of case law, complex transactions, urban planning and community improvement in a matter of weeks was perhaps shortsighted. Now, State Legislators have introduced numerous bills seeking to fix the situation. A number of the bills gathered some momentum; however their progress is slowing. Maybe this is due to the realization that a true remedy will require a comprehensive approach to the problem, or maybe it is because legislative leaders understand that any solution will be intertwined with the adoption of next year's State budget. Ultimately, the impact on California communities is the same--local resources and decision-making are being denied.

The loss of the redevelopment agency is being felt inside the City of Glendale organization; soon it will be felt out on the Glendale Welcomes a New Park Just in time for spring...

street. Recently the Community Development Department learned that its workforce will be cut by 28 full-time positions. These range from the Neighborhood Services Section, to Community Planning, to Economic Development. These positions represent key employees who provide important services to the City. Just as important, the loss of redevelopment funding means that the resources of that former agency are lost as well. The elimination of a \$7 million loan repayment from the Agency to the City may trigger more cutbacks and service reductions; and a "fire sale" of Agency assets like the historic Alex Theatre could mean the end of the public's enjoyment of that venue.

In the end, the State must own up to its elimination of redevelopment agencies. The City of Glendale will do what most cities do well--we will adapt and overcome. There will be painful cuts and reductions in services. But the future of California rests with its cities' resilency, creativity and dedication to public service. If the State cannot fully appreciate the magnitude of the loss of redevelopment, there is no way it can learn anything from this episode. And if the State cannot take away any meaningful lesson from this situation, then we are very likely to repeat it.



Verdugo Road Gets a Facelift

The Verdugo Road Rehabilitation Project, which began in late summer 2011, is nearly complete. The benefits of street resurfacing include the rehabilitation of existing streets that have deteriorated beyond normal maintenance work such as slurry seal, crack seal or pothole repair. As part of the Project, 66 new parkway trees were also planted. Street resurfacing improves the ride along the road and the structural integrity of the pavement, providing a new service life for the street.

The Project was partly funded by the voter-approved "Measure R Funds" in the amount of \$750,000 to improve the traffic signal facilities at intersections, enhance traffic flow, increase pedestrian safety and comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act. The trees enhance the streetscape and expand Glendale's urban forest. Glendale's street resurfacing and road repair projects help create jobs, save motorists repair costs, help provide our community with increased safety and aid local economic growth by making our streets more attractive.
