### Convenient Christmas Tree Recycling December 26, 2012 through January 18, 2013

Remember to recycle Christmas trees after the holiday season with the Integrated Waste Management Division's free curbside recycling program. Follow these easy steps to recycle your Christmas tree:

- 1. Remove all ornaments, decorations, nails, buckets, bags, and stands. Tinsel and flocked trees are acceptable.
- 2. Trees greater than eight feet tall should be cut in half.
- Single-family homes: place trees next to refuse on service day.
- Apartments and businesses: place trees together in the parkway by 7:00 am on service day (beginning at 7:00 pm the night before). Do not place trees in refuse collection rooms.

## Holiday Refuse Collection Changes

The City of Glendale Integrated Waste Management Division will not provide refuse collection on December 25th or January 1st. Between December 25th and January 4th, customers with Tuesday through Friday refuse collection will be serviced one day later. For example, customers with Tuesday collection will be serviced Wednesday, and customers with Friday collection will be serviced Saturday. Monday refuse collection will not be affected.

Also, be sure to keep small children away from hot appliances to prevent injuries. Do not place oven mitts, pot holders, or any other flammable items on the stove.

# Stay Sober or Get Pulled Over

'Tis the season for festivities and the Glendale Police Department (GPD) would like to remind the community to stay responsible during the holidays. The ongoing campaign, *Stay Sober or Get Pulled Over*, will have extra enforcement this December with DUI saturations and checkpoints. GPD will have additional officers on the roads to keep Glendale safe from impaired drivers; those caught driving impaired can expect jail, license suspension, insurance increases, as well as fines and fees that can exceed \$10,000.

DUI deaths remain the largest percentage of all traffic fatalities at a staggering 30% nationally. Working together, these fatalities can be reduced. Always make sure to have a designated driver or cab fare to make it home safely. If a driver is suspected of being under the influence of drugs or alcohol, call 911.

Economic Indicators Dashboard

November 2012 Highlights

Glendale Economic Indicators conveyed stability with modest growth over last year, indicating growing potential. Class A office vacancy inched down to 22.3%, versus 24.5% at the close of 2011. Retail property vacancy remained flat at 3.9% against year end 2011; and industrial property vacancy tightened to 2.2%, versus 4.0% last year, showing continued high demand for Glendale in these sectors.

Ending 2011 as one of the nation's safest cities over 100,000 in population, Glendale crime statistics still improved with a 15.6% reduction in violent crimes reported and a 9.5% reduction in property crimes reported.

Sales tax collected in the second quarter of 2012 was 6.0% ahead of the same period in 2011, reflecting growing consumer confidence. According to <u>Zillow.com</u>, Glendale's median home price of \$497,000, softened in September 2012 compared to September 2011 with a 1.5% reduction.
