Watch that Speedometer!

AB529, which gives local agencies more flexibility to set their own speed limits, has been signed into law. Speed data is gathered on the roads, and then speed limits are set based on the average speed that 85% of the traffic is moving. Under the previous law, agencies could round up to the nearest 5% increment; i.e. if the average speed was 37.5 miles per hour (mph), the limit could be set at 40 mph. Under AB529, local agencies are given the option to round down to the nearest 5% increment; i.e. in the above case, the speed limit could be set at 35 mph. This new law allows local agencies to set limits that will make their communities safer for drivers and pedestrians.

Does Your Home Comply with New Electrical Codes?

The National Electrical Code has implemented two code changes now in effect for residential dwellings. A dwelling unit is defined as a single unit providing complete and independent living facilities for one or more persons including living, sleeping, cooking and sanitation facilities.

Under the code, all new and renovated dwellings must have tamper-resistant receptacles. These are plastic covers that close off the contact openings on electrical receptacles, making the home safer for everyone.

Also, Arc Fault circuit interrupter protection is required in all new residential dwellings and/or existing residences and additions. This applies to all 120 volt, single phase 15 and 20 amp branch circuits. Some older electrical panels may need to be changed to meet the new requirements during a rewire. These breakers are intended to protect against fire.

Rossmoyne Nominated for Historic District

The Historic Preservation Commission recently approved the Historic Resource Survey for the proposed Rossmoyne Historic District, and also authorized the distribution of a petition asking the City to designate the District. If owners of more than 50% of the homes in the area sign the petition, the nomination will move forward with future hearings before the Historic Preservation and Planning Commissions and a final vote by City Council. Historic resource surveys for two other proposed historic districts, North Cumberland Heights and Brockmont Park, are underway and will go through a similar review process.

2012 "I Love My Neighborhood" Poster Contest

The 2012 <u>"I Love My Neighborhood Poster Contest"</u> is underway for elementary students from public and private schools in Glendale. This year's theme is "I Am Part of My Neighborhood." Students submit self-drawn posters showing civic pride by keeping their neighborhoods litter and graffiti free. Last year, over 9,000 entries were submitted! The Grand Prize poster is reproduced and distributed throughout the community as part of a multimedia campaign.
