Glendale Transportation Center Dedicated to Larry Zarian

The Glendale Transportation Center was re-named the Larry Zarian Transportation Center on November 30 at a large public gathering. Zarian, a former Glendale Council Member for

16 years and Mayor of the City for four terms, passed away last fall.

Larry Zarian spent more than 30 years working to improve transportation--not only in Glendale, but statewide and nationally. He served on the National Highway Safety Commission, the LA County Metropolitan Transportation Authority and on the State of California's Transportation Commission.

Re-dedicating the Transportation Center in his name is a way of honoring the man who did so much for the City of Glendale. In addition to the sign shown here, a bronze plaque will be installed on the historic train station building at a later date.

North Glendale Now Has a Community Plan

The North Glendale Community Plan has been adopted and beginning January 5, all projects in the Plan area must conform to the vision, policies and design guidelines listed here:

- The maximum allowable height on Foothill Boulevard will be reduced from 50 feet to 35 feet.
- The maximum allowable height on the west side of Ocean View will be reduced from 50 to 35 feet.
- There will be no change in the maximum allowable height on the north side of Verdugo Boulevard (had been proposed to be changed from 35 feet to 45 feet).
- The CR Zone was extended to include Trader Joe's (on the south side of Honolulu Avenue).

Don't Toss Your Batteries: Recycle!

After the holidays, everyone seems to be using new electronic gadgets or battery-operated toys. All these items drain thousands of batteries. When your batteries are "dead," please don't toss into the trash. Not only is this bad for the environment, it's against the law in California. Used batteries contain toxins such as cadmium, mercury, zinc and lithium.

Glendale has made it easy for residents to dispose of used batteries properly. Drop-off sites are located throughout the City for this purpose (see graphic below.) Small batteries can be recycled at these locations. Larger batteries such as computer or lead-acid car batteries should be turned in at the Environmental Management Center (EMC), 780 Flower Street.
