

Pacific Park Pool

The newly constructed Pacific Park Pool will open to the public June 4. This much-anticipated project has been in the planning and funding stages since 2006. Construction began in December 2010 and was completed in record time (6 months)!

The pool is designed in an L-shape, providing a large (45 foot X 85 foot) shallow area for water play, recreation and instruction. The swim area features 6 lanes, 25 yards in length. The new pool building provides ample bathrooms, showers, lockers and family changing rooms. Environmental green design is a major feature of this project. Recycled building materials have been used extensively throughout the project and it also features a photovoltaic solar energy system. Total project costs are approximately \$6M with funds provided through Community Development Block Grant funding and State of California Proposition 40 grant programs.

Registration for swim lessons and aquatic programs will be held in the Pacific Community Center Gym, 501 S. Pacific Avenue on June 11 from 7:00 am – 10:00 am and on June 12 from 8:00 am – 10:00 am. Public Works to Install new ADA Curb Ramps

The Public Works Department recently began

construction of the 2010-2011 Fiscal Year American with Disabilities Act (ADA) Curb Ramp and Sidewalk Repair and Installation Program. This project includes installation of new curb ramps, replacement of substandard curb ramps and replacement of broken or deteriorated sidewalk. In addition, some deteriorating or overgrown street trees will be removed and replaced; seven bus stops will be improved and a new alley speed breaker will be installed.

The project area includes the neighborhood north of Kenneth Road between Virginia Avenue and Pacific Avenue, and the neighborhood south of the I-5 freeway between Western Avenue and Paula Avenue.

A new five-foot sidewalk will be installed along the east side of Grandview between Kenneth Road and Crestview, and on the north side of Matilija Road between Grandview and 1021 Matilija. This new sidewalk will connect with existing sidewalks and provide a continuous and uninterrupted walkway for pedestrians.

This Project will improve accessibility for people with disabilities in the western part of the City and enhance safety for all pedestrians. Completion is expected in August. Questions about this project should be directed to Steven Lujan at (818) 548-3986.
