## MESSAGE FROM SCOTT OCHOA



On Wednesday, April 24, the City of Glendale will host its 12th Annual Armenian Genocide Commemoration Event. The event will take place from 7:00 - 8:30 pm at the beautiful Alex Theatre, located at 216 N. Brand Blvd.

This year's event will feature multiple traditional Armenian dance and musical performances by local students. The keynote speaker will be Micheline Aharonian Marcom. Ms. Marcom has published four novels, including a trilogy of books about the Armenian genocide and its aftermath in the twentieth century.

Mayor Frank Quintero will serve as Chair of the event, along with Co-Chair Council Member Ara Najarian. Members of the local clergy, as well as federal and state political leaders will also be in attendance.


are apt to tell you what you want to hear.

# Free Self-Defense Classes for Women & Girls



Violence against women is recognized today as a major issue on the international human rights agenda. This includes: rape/sexual assault (every 2.5 minutes in the US.), intimate partner abuse (every 15 seconds in the US), and human trafficking of women and girls as sex slaves. The trauma of sexual coercion and assault at different stages of a woman's life-cycle can leave many women and girls with severe loss of self-esteem, health, and autonomy.

April is Sexual Assault Awareness Month, and in an effort to promote prevention of sexual assaults against women and girls, the Glendale Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) is providing FREE SELF-DEFENSE CLASSES to women and girls ages 12 and up.



Three Glendale retailers joined California's PaintCare Program to accept leftover paint products for recycling and proper disposal. Leftover paint can harm the environment by polluting waterways and groundwater, and by endangering wildlife. Easily dispose of these items for free (in containers of five gallons or less) at participating retailers:

- Interior and exterior architectural paints: latex, acrylic, water-based, alkyd, oil-based, and enamel (all types of finishes and sheens, including textured coatings)
- Deck coatings, floor paints (including elastomeric)
- Primers, sealers, undercoaters
- Stains
- Shellacs, lacquers, varnishes, urethanes (single component)
- Waterproofing concrete/masonry/wood sealers and repellants (not tar or bitumen-based)
- Swimming pool paints (single component)
- · Metal coatings, rust preventatives

## Public Works Completes Windstorm Tree Replacement Grant Project

In March 2013, the City of Glendale finished planting all 350 replacement trees for those trees lost during the extreme windstorms from November 30 - December 1, 2011.

This effort, funded by the Los Angeles County 2012 Competitive Tree Planting Grant Program, took approximately 3 months to complete. The City used the services of the Glendale Youth Alliance (GYA), who employs at-risk youth, to perform the majority of the plantings. These new trees will be integrated into the City's Young Tree Maintenance Program where they will receive the recommended watering, pruning and fertilizing attention to encourage them to grow into healthy mature trees.

As the windstorms uprooted and fatally damaged trees throughout the entire City of Glendale, the Windstorm Recovery Program, which replaced these trees, will truly benefit the entire City for many years to come.

See story above for more info. With the start of spring, the Glendale Fire Department begins its implementation of preventive measures for wildland-urban fires. Due to the unique geography of the City of Glendale and residents living in canyons and hillsides, much of Glendale has been identified as a very high fire hazard zone. Glendale's Fire Prevention Bureau, in conjunction with firefighter personnel, inspects properties for hazardous vegetation. Homeowners, especially those in the canyons and hillsides, are required to complete abatement measures known as the Defensible Space Concept on their property (per City ordinance).

Residents who reside in high fire hazard zones will receive notice from Glendale's Fire Prevention Bureau mid-April regarding the need to create a defensible space around their homes in order to protect against fire. In May, property inspections will commence to ensure compliance with City ordinances, and abatement work not adequate per code or not completed in a timely manner will receive notices, any may possbily receive fines. If abatement is not completed, the Glendale Fire Department may hire contractors to complete the work and bill those fees to the homeowner. Homeowners are encouraged to ask questions when fire personnel are at their homes to ensure understanding of proper abatement measures.
