Glendale Receives an "A"



For the fifth consecutive year, Glendale received an "A" from the <u>American Lung Association</u>. This score ranks Glendale among the healthiest Los Angeles County cities in exposure to second-hand tobacco smoke. The "A" grade comes from Glendale's total points in three categories, Smokefree Outdoor Air, Smokefree Housing, and Reducing Sales of Tobacco Products.

The Glendale City Council continuously strives to improve air quality in the community. Since the City's adoption of the Fresh Air Ordinance in 2008, the City has worked with businesses, restaurants, and apartment owners with ordinance education, and enforces Glendale's smoke-free environments. The Glendale City Council is committed to making Glendale a healthier city for those who live, work, go to school, and conduct business here. This comparative analysis further demonstrates the realization of value for the public safety dollars appropriated by the City Council.

- The City Council recently received a report from the Public Works Department detailing more than \$100 million in public infrastructure investments ranging from street and traffic-calming improvements, to water and sewer system improvements, to much needed electrical system upgrades.

- Several new parks and library facilities are set to be delivered to community use this spring, including the Brand Library and Arts Center, Pacific Community Center artificial soccer field replacement, Maryland Avenue Park, and Maple Avenue Park.

- New affordable housing opportunities are underway in and around downtown Glendale, spearheaded by the Cypress Avenue senior housing development and the Veteran's Village development (consideration given to veterans of the US Armed Forces).

- Vibrant new businesses are now calling Glendale home, including Avery Dennison corporate headquarters and New York Life.

There is plenty to be proud of in this amazing community. And yet, while we continue to deliver quality services and public projects to our residents and businesses, we must remain vigilant about our costs of operation and ensure that we have the resources to adequately staff our assorted City departments.

The Great Recession wreaked havoc on this organization. In order to live within our means, the City of Glendale absorbed several consecutive years of multi-million dollar cuts to its General Fund. Yet in partnership with our employees and volunteers, we have been able to sustain much of the level of service desired and expected by our community. Glendale Police Department Year in Review



The Glendale Police Department has released their year end <u>statistics for 2013</u>. Glendale experienced some positive trends including the reduction of violent crimes, such as robbery and aggravated assault, and low response times for emergency calls even with reduced staffing and increased local traffic. There were also some negative trends seen in 2013 and GPD is seeking the community's assistance in curbing these trends in 2014. Unfortunately, property crimes have increased. This is a trend for communities that are affluent and enjoy a high quality of life. This increase can be attributed to AB109, California's Public Safety Realignment law, which releases an increase of property crime criminals and transfers supervision to local counties. LA County has received 20,000 of these releases. Injury and fatal traffic collisions have also increased in Glendale and throughout the region.

While all cities face challenges, Glendale residents can rest assured that the city is currently ranked as the #5 <u>safest city</u> in California and #9 nationally among cities with a population of 100,000 or more.

In the coming budget year the City Council and community will need to make long-term decisions about our operational priorities and the means of funding them. The operational balance of our budget will only continue as long as we keep balance among our costs, obligations, desires and visions. 
