MESSAGE FROM SCOTT OCHOA



Glendale City Manager

I am in a thankful mood; and considering that it's November and nearing Thanksgiving, now seems an ideal time to express it.

Recently, I have been meeting with different groups of people - community members, business leaders, employees, etc. talking about the future of Glendale. In these group discussions and meetings, unanimous agreement on any particular topic is scarce. Indeed, where you stand depends on where you sit. For example, some folks want the City to maintain a great deal of control over the architecture and materials of private homes surrounding their own. Other folks believe that if they own their home and they pay the taxes on it, then why should anyone else get to have input on the styling/customization of their property? Still other folks are happy to oblige the requirements of neighborhood compatibility, but just want the process itself to move more quickly and be more predictable.

In other arenas, residents want quality services and value for their tax dollar. Businesses want to keep costs low and

Our organization has survived the Great Recession and emerged stronger, healthier and more nimble - that is a testament to our people, from the electric line mechanics and trash truck operators, to the librarians and planners, to the cops and paramedics. Though we may occasionally find ourselves balancing competing priorities, there is - and will continue to be - one unifying factor: Glendale. And, because of that fact, we always, somehow, find a reasonable way forward.

This is special. Certainly you can't find it in Washington and rarely find it in Sacramento. But we are here in Glendale and I, for one, am thankful for that.







Free mulch is available to all Glendale residents at Brand Park. The mulch is the byproduct of the City's street tree trimming program and is widely used in landscaping and gardens. Mulch prevents weeds and the loss of soil caused by heavy rains. Mulch also helps the soil retain moisture which saves water used for irrigation. Mulch insulates soil, promoting healthy root growth and nutrient availability. Finally, as mulch decomposes, it provides nutrients to the soil below. Wood chip mulch can be expected to last for approximately two years.
