### Fire Prevention Week October 6 - 12



Fire Prevention Week commemorates the Great Chicago Fire of 1871. The two-day blaze killed more than 250 people, left 100,000 more homeless, and destroyed more than 17,000 buildings. This year, Fire Prevention Week is focusing on how to prevent fires in the kitchen. In 2011, cooking was involved in an estimated 156,300 home fires that caused 470 deaths, 5,390 injuries, and \$1 billion in property damage.

The Glendale Fire Department (GFD) encourages families to implement a few simple techniques into their daily cooking to prevent fire, injury and loss. Clean up food and grease from the burners after every use. Keep children a minimum of 3 feet away from the stove/oven while cooking. Ensure smoke detectors and fire alarms are installed and properly functioning into all businesses and residences.

Running medical equipment around-the-clock can get expensive. 


