## MESSAGE FROM SCOTT OCHOA



Glendale City Manager

Part of protecting the public trust and treasury is demonstrating value for the tax and fee dollars paid to the City of Glendale. In my experience, folks generally don't mind paying for municipal services so long as they can understand where the funding goes, how it contributes to the overall benefit of the community, and that the amounts are consistent with the realities of the market.

Disclosing this information consistently and accurately to the community is central to the concept of government transparency. Yet to an even greater degree, the City of Glendale's commitment to transparency and giving context to the value of municipal services is profiled by the manner in which all of this information is disclosed. That is, we believe that it is not sufficient to simply do a "data dump" and expect laypeople to distinguish between salient, important information and filler. Making information useful means giving it a context and "slicing and dicing" the information into different frames and filters. It means explaining how various performance indicators tell a

#### How do I learn more about the candidates?

How do I learn more about other items on the ballot? Voters will vote on three Charter Amendments (C, D, E) and one Ballot Measure (O). Information on each of these may be viewed here.

Where and when can I return a vote-by-mail ballot? Vote-by-mail ballots can be returned by mail or in person to the City Clerk's Office at 613 E. Broadway, Suite 110. Ballots must be postmarked or hand-delivered by Election Day: Tuesday, April 7. Ballots may also be turned in at any Glendale polling location on Election Day.

#### Week of Remembrance



April 24, 2015 marks the 100th commemoration of the Armenian Genocide. Every year, April brings about a time to reflect upon the 1.5 million Armenian people who senselessly lost their lives in an act of genocide committed by the Ottoman Empire. Glendale is home to the largest Armenian population outside of Armenia and annually remembers the victims of the Armenian Genocide and the victims of man's inhumanity throughout the world.

A number of events to remember the lives lost and to celebrate the accomplishments those who survived will occur during the month of April and are hosted by the Glendale City Council, life 100 organizing committee, Armenian Genocide Centennial Committee, Glendale City taff and members of Glendale community organizations and partners. As the Centennial approaches, the City of Glendale encourages everyone to reflect and remember the atrocities of 1915 while participating in the numerous programs being hosted.



## West Nile Virus Detected in LA County

In March 2015, mosquitoes infected with the West Nile Virus (WNV) were detected by the Greater Los Angeles County Vector Control District (GLACVCD) for the first time this year. The City of Glendale encourages residents to protect themselves from WNV with mosquito repellent containing EPA-registered ingredients such as DEET and Picaridin especially between July-September when mosquito activity will be at its peak. Long sleeves are also effective in reducing bites on arms. Most mosquito activity occurs in the early morning or at dusk. Residents should check that all screens on windows and doors fit tightly and are free of holes where mosquitoes can pass through. It's also advisable for residents to abate any standing water on their property. Standing water on private property, such as a neglected swimming pool, can

## Glendale Dodger Night: May 15



### Recycling Container Grant

The City Council is committed to a cleaner, more sustainable Glendale as part of the Zero Waste Plan adopted in 2011. The City of Glendale recycles 20,053 tons each year and in an effort to make even greater contributions to the City's Zero Waste goals, the City's Public Works Department recently submitted for and was awarded \$219,996 from the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle). The City of Glendale, one of 18 public agencies in California to be awarded this competitive grant, will use the funding to introduce recycling litter baskets in the City's business districts of Montrose and Downtown Glendale. ## **Project Lifesaver**



The Glendale Police Department has partnered with <u>Project Lifesaver</u> to provide assistance with quickly locating "at risk" individuals with cognitive disorders. This project assists those who exhibit the life threatening behavior of wandering, including those with Alzheimer's disease, Autism, and Down syndrome. Project Lifesaver has over 1,300 participating agencies throughout 47 states in the United States, Canada, and Australia, and has performed over 2,959 searches over the last 15

years with no serious injuries or fatalities reported.

Project Lifesaver has provided in-depth training to Glendale Police Officers on the use of the specialized electronic search and rescue equipment, as well as teaching rescuers how to communicate with individuals afflicted with cognitive conditions. ## Free Landscape Classes



Learn how to transform your water guzzling landscape into a California Friendly, water efficient landscape. Glendale Water & Power, in partnership with the Metropolitan Water District, is offering free CA Friendly Landscape classes to Glendale residents. Each class will teach residents

about landscape design, how to install, and maintain a smart irrigation system, and how to choose the right plants for different areas of landscaping. All classes are on Saturdays from 9:00 am - 12:00 pm. Space is limited, please view schedule and sign up here.

## Water Conservation Tips

The average Californian uses 196 gallons of water per day. Make a goal and reduce your water use by 25%. There are lots of simple ways to reduce the amount of water we use at home, both inside and outside. Glendale is still in Mandatory Water Conservation. This means residents can only water their landscapes on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays for no more than 10 minutes at each watering station.

Install aerators on the kitchen faucet to reduce flows to less than 1 gallon per minute. Be sure to test your toilet for leaks at least once a year. Retrofitting your garden with California Friendly plants is one of the best ways to reduce water use in your landscape. Report water waste anonymously by calling GWP's water waster hotline at (818) 550-4426 or submit an online form on GWP's website.
