
Hot August nights And the leaves hanging down And the grass of the ground smellin' sweet

Green Streets Demonstration Project



Plans are underway to construct the City's first Green Streets Demonstration Project. This environmentally friendly project will take place on approximately 1.1 miles of roadway on Harvard Street between Brand Boulevard and Isabel Street, and on Louise Street between Maple Avenue and Wilson Avenue in downtown Glendale. It will provide a safe and inviting pathway to encourage walking and biking to the Central Library, Adult Recreation Center, YMCA, Americana at Brand, Glendale Galleria, and the future Museum of Neon Art. There are plans to expand this pilot project into a citywide network of greenways as discussed in the City's adopted Bicycle <u>Transportation Plan</u>.

Planning for the project will occur from late 2014 through late 2015, with construction of the project to begin in early- mid 2016. Learn more about the project here.

<u>Survey</u> scores 24 areas throughout the City including freeways, industrial, residential and commercial neighborhoods. This year the average citywide score improved from 1.52 in 2013 to 1.45. The improvements can be an indicator that programs implemented to eliminate litter by raising awareness and civic participation in Glendale are on the right path.

Volunteers play an important role in the reduction of visible litter from the streets of Glendale. By participating in the City's <u>Adopt-A-Block Program</u>, volunteers spent over 5,800 hours on community clean-up projects around their neighborhood this past year, resulting in cleaner, less littered neighborhoods. Phase 2 of Mandatory Water Conservation

Watering Restricted to Three Days a Week



The Glendale City Council has declared Phase II of Glendale Water & Power's (GWP) Water Conservation Ordinance. Phase II will limit outside watering to three days a week: Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday for 10 minutes at each watering station. Customers can anonymously report water waste by calling GWP's water waster hotline at (818) 550-4426 or submit an online form at GlendaleWaterAndPower.com.

Outdoor landscaping consumes 60% of household water use. Replacing lawns with California native plants is a great way to cut water bills in half. Glendale residents are encourages to take advantage of GWP's Turf Replacement Rebate Program, and receive \$2.00 a square foot from MWD by replacing grass with California native plants.
