Refuse Questions Over the Holidays



Will refuse collection be affected by the holidays?

The Glendale Integrated Waste Management Division will not provide refuse collection service on December 25 or January 1. On all other holidays, refuse service will remain unaffected. Between December 25 and January 2, Thursday and Friday refuse customers will be serviced one day later. For example, customers with Thursday service will be picked up Friday and customers with Friday service will be picked up on Saturday. Customers with Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday service will be unaffected. For questions, please call the Integrated Waste Management Division at (818) 548-3916.



How can I dispose of my holiday tree at the end of the season? Holiday trees can be recycled December 26 through January 16. Place your tree at the curb or in the alley for pick-up on your refuse-collection day. If you are uncertain about your service day, call the City of Glendale's Integrated Waste Management Division at (818) 548-3916 or visit GlendaleRecycle.com.

How can I reduce holiday waste?





Download GWP's Mobile Application



Glendale Water & Power's new free mobile app, GWP - Mobile My Connect, allows customers to view current and historical bills as well as pay bills, set budget goals, submit service requests, view/report outages, send messages directly to GWP, and obtain electric vehicle or solar panel usage information. The pilot program is free and will be offered to the first 2,000 Glendale residential customers that download the app.

After downloading the application, customers will be asked to input their account information. Volunteers Needed

Continuums of Care (CoCs) across the country undertake community-wide efforts to collect information on the number and characteristics of individuals and families experiencing homelessness. New Digital Parking Meter Feature



The City of Glendale has added a new "Extend-by-Phone" feature to all Digital parking meters in Downtown Glendale. This feature allows customers who pay by credit card the ability to receive a reminder text that their parking is about to expire. If desired, the customer may add time (up to the maximum posted time limit) to their parking

meter via a text message for an additional twenty-five cent service fee. To take advantage of this feature, customers must enter their cell phone number at the end of the parking transaction and press "OK."
