## **Operation Trail Maker**



The Glendale Parks & Open Space Foundation, in collaboration with Los Angeles Magazine, has launched Operation Trail Marker, a new project to improve trail signage in the Verdugo Mountains of Glendale. The Foundation hopes to raise \$20,000 to design, fabricate, and install 30 new way-finding signs in the Verdugos through crowdfunding efforts.

The Verdugos offer more than 25 miles of trails and fire roads for hiking, biking, and pure recreation, but they lack a good system of trail signage. The Verdugo Mountains project is the first of what is hoped to be many similar projects to make hiking and biking safer and more convenient through the mountains of Los Angeles. *Learn more here or donate directly here*.

## **Arbor Day**



knowledge regarding the Glendale Fire Department's paramedic program; they may not be electrical engineers but they need to have an appreciation of GWP's electrical grid and the role that our power plant plays in the overall system. This requires time, attention, and diligence and that's what makes an outstanding City Councilmember.

To this end, and as a demonstration that lifelong learning is essential to success (as Coach John Wooden once observed, "It's what you learn after you know it all that counts"), the Glendale City Council will inaugurate in the month of February "Work Boot Tuesdays." An outgrowth of Mayor Sinanyan's effort to do more outreach to the community as well as edify the City Council team about significant public service and infrastructure efforts underway, Work Boot Tuesday will occur once a month, in lieu of the City Council's customary afternoon session. As the Council has pushed to ebb the amount of development in the downtown specific plan (DSP) area, the opportunity has arisen to repurpose the afternoon hours to conduct a site visit of Glendale's critical systems and programs. The sessions are technically special City Council meetings, complete with roll call and public comment. The real purpose of the sessions, however, is to put boots on the ground and allow the Councilmembers to familiarize themselves with the people and operations that deliver services to Glendale residents and businesses.

The first Work Boot Tuesday is scheduled for February 24th and will be held at Grayson Power Plant. The Council will be briefed by power plant personnel and then tour the facility. Members of the public will be invited to join the tours. The Grayson site visit is important to the Council's consideration of the GWP Integrated Resource Plan (IRP), which will outline the future options for the Council as they pertain to potentially repowering the plant - an undertaking that would comprise the largest single public works project in the

#### **Upcoming Elections**



The City of Glendale's Municipal Election will take place on Tuesday, April 7, 2015. Polls will be open from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm. This year, registered voters will be able to vote for two members for City Council, two members for the Glendale Unified School District Board, and two members for the Glendale Community College Board of Trustees. Additionally, voters will be voting on three Charter amendments and a measure on the City's Transient Occupancy Tax.

This undertaking requires dedication and focus by Councilmembers. But then, this is February in Glendale and we have a great deal to celebrate.



## Traffic Safety - A Priority



Traffic and pedestrian safety continues to be an important concern for the Glendale City Council. At their direction, a Pedestrian Safety Task Force was formed last year to analyze collision and engineering data and further engage the community. The Task Force, comprised of City staff, Transportation & Parking Commissioners, and community stakeholders, developed a multifaceted problem identification report. Through Enforcement, Education, Engineering, Evaluation, and Encouragement (5 E's) the City has launched many programs to help with a successful campaign that will lead to a behavioral change in our pedestrians and drivers. Another component of the overall program that will continue to encourage the conversation of pedestrian safety is the new Pedestrian Flag Program. The City installed flag holders at the Colorado and Jackson intersection and the Kimlin Drive and Chevy Chase Drive intersection on January 22. The City's pilot program involves placing high-visibility flags at uncontrolled crosswalks for



## Glendale Receives an "A" from American Lung Association



For the sixth consecutive year, Glendale received an "A" from the <u>American Lung Association</u>. This score ranks Glendale among the healthiest Los Angeles County cities in exposure to second-hand tobacco smoke. Glendale is also the largest city in California, by population size, to receive the "A" grade. The "A" grade comes from Glendale's total points in three categories: Smokefree Outdoor Air, Smokefree Housing, and Reducing Sales of Tobacco Products. *Learn more here*.

#### Multi-Family Housing Now More Eco-Friendly

The City of Glendale's Public Works Department has recently completed a comprehensive project to replace 550 small grey automated recycling containers with 85 2-cubic yard recycling bins at multi-family residential buildings. These new larger bins can hold as much material as four of the smaller containers and provide customers with more capacity for larger recyclables. The recycling bins will provide an overall cleaner, less cluttered look for properties while also increasing the convenience of recycling! The City of Glendale is committed to achieving a goal of 75% waste diversion from the landfill by the year 2020 and will continue to seek ways to make recycling even easier for the community.

To help expedite the insurance claim process for car accidents and better serve our citizens and their insurance carriers, the Glendale Police Department has partnered with LexisNexis to make the majority of our traffic accident reports available for purchase online for a \$10 convenience fee.

This convenient service saves you time and allows you to share the report with insurance companies sooner. Reports requiring a criminal investigation, like hit and runs, may be delayed and/or not available online.

Individuals who do not wish to pay the convenience fee can still request a copy of their traffic accident report in person for \$16. The Records Bureau public counter hours are Monday - Friday 10:00 am -
