Affordable Housing Opportunity for Veterans



In advance of Veteran's Day, the Housing Authority of the City of Glendale would like to highlight its efforts and announce its newest opportunity towards providing affordable housing for lower income veterans. Recently, the Glendale Housing Authority celebrated the completion of Cypress Senior Living, an approximate \$5 million acquisition and rehabilitation project. Six of the 17 units were reserved for lower income senior veterans. The <u>profile</u> of Cypress Senior Living provides details of the project and highlights the service and lives of two of the veterans residing there.

<u>Veterans Village</u> is Glendale's newest affordable housing project expected to be completed in June 2015. The project is reserved for lower income family households, with a preference for veteran families. Mandatory Water Conservation



As the weather cools down, lawns and plants do not need as much water. As part of Mandatory Water Conservation, remember to set your sprinkler to water the landscape only Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays for 10 minutes or less at each watering station. Remember to turn off sprinklers a few days before rain and keep them off at least three days after. To test when your lawn needs water, step on the grass, if the grass springs back, it does not need to be watered.


