

Great ShakeOut



The Great ShakeOut is Thursday, October 15 at 10:15 am. The Glendale Fire Department encourages residents to participate in the Great ShakeOut by practicing DROP, COVER and HOLD. It is important to stop and DROP to the ground, take COVER under a table, and HOLD onto it while the ground is moving during an earthquake. After the shaking stops, survey your surroundings, locate your emergency kit, and be prepared for aftershocks. After practicing DROP, COVER and HOLD during the Great ShakeOut, register for **Everbridge**, the city-wide notification system, and follow the City of Glendale and the Glendale Fire


Glendale's Class A office occupancy continues to be on par

Chevy Chase Sewer Project

The upcoming Chevy Chase Sewer Diversion and Public Works Yard Recycled Water Main Extension project is expected to start late October and be completed by February 2017. The goal of this project is to reroute the waste water from the Hyperion treatment plant in the City of Los Angeles to the joint Los Angeles/Glendale Water Reclamation Plant. By rerouting the waste water it will save Glendale approximately \$1 million annually and it will help prevent any potential backups starting in Los Angeles from reaching our City. The construction of this project will impact traffic on San Fernando Road between Elk Avenue and Chevy Chase Drive in different areas throughout the duration of this project. Staff will be working closely with the contractor to minimize the impacts by rerouting traffic, posting detour signs, and providing the appropriate notifications in advance.
