# MESSAGE FROM SCOTT OCHOA

Labor Day marks the traditional end of the summer and calls out the beginning of autumn - the season of change. This is a perfect marriage of sentiments, in my view: Labor Day - the commemoration of the sacrifice and ingenuity of American workers; and autumn - the annual metamorphosis of our environs.

Currently, the weight of our ongoing reorganization is upon us. The City Council has approved a separation / retirement incentive program that drew scores of employees, all with the understanding that we would hold as many positions vacant as possible. The strategy behind this move is that, by keeping the positions vacant, we will free up resource capacity that can then be reinvested in the organization in order to best sustain high-quality services to our residents and businesses. In removing these positions needed, useful positions - from our disposal, we are forced to evolve our organization yet again. The City of Glendale is a full-service municipality, yet our charge is to redefine what that means in a manner that meets expectations, satisfies both law and policy, and

# **Home Water Reports**

Glendale Water and Power in partnership with WaterSmart Software, has launched a pilot of the WaterInsight Program to encourage more water conservation among residential customers. The program includes WaterSmart's bi-monthly Home Water Report designed to provide 18,000 single-family residential customers with a more in depth understanding of their water consumption, and help drive conservation among residents. In addition to the reports, pilot participants will have online access to their profile and usage information via the WaterInsight customer portal. ### Free Shade Trees



The Tree Power Program helps eligible residential customers save energy by offering up to three free shade trees. Residents may choose from a list of 30 different varieties to plant on their property which can help save 10% - 50% in air conditioning costs.

Experiments and trials and pilot programs that are implemented, evaluated, and adjusted might not resemble structures and/or programs utilized in the past and that is ok. If we are intelligent, earnest and resourceful then I suspect we will uncover any number of paths toward achievement and success. This season of change - new, somewhat pressing, sometimes scary - will yield a leaner and more nimble organization that is even more keenly focused on its priorities. Its structures might not have been designed by anything other than necessity and practicality; yet we today have the construct in which we can experiment with creativity and inventiveness.

Which brings me back to Labor Day.

I can think of few groups of people with whom I would rather undertake such a difficult challenge (maybe the 1979 Steelers, or the 1986-87 Lakers, or the 1981 Dodgers). The employees of the City of Glendale have pride in their work, dedication to our residents and businesses, and a commitment to exceptional customer service. This fall, we will commence on a period of transition revolving around unlearning, rethinking, and problem-solving. Accepting as a backdrop the "brutal facts" wrought by the Great Recession, we will strive to identify the goal, apply the lens of policy and law, and then the context of resources and priority. Easier said than done, to be sure; but I believe that our employees are ready for the challenge ahead. Indeed, as the reorganization has gotten underway, many of our people have openly voiced their ideas, suggestions and concerns. We talk about the opportunity to contribute more, and identify "blind spots" and liabilities. In the end, my sentiment is always the same: all solutions are temporary until they aren't. Now is the time to rollout the previously difficult option and/or unpalatable alternative. Truly, the silver lining of the Great Recession is that we have the opportunity to honestly ask ourselves: "Tell me ties, arbor guards, and an instructional DVD on tree planting and maintenance. # **Employment Opportunities for Youth**



The Glendale Youth Alliance provides year-round training and employment opportunities to youth in the Glendale area. Applications are now available for two career enhancing programs:

Training, Employment & Mentoring Program (TEAM) - Seniors in high school receive pre-employment soft skills training and are placed within City departments, local non-profit and for-profit agencies to receive hands-on paid work experience. Must be a high school senior, reside in Glendale, Burbank or La Cañada and be from a low-income family to qualify for the program.

Employment Incentive Program (EIP) - Older youth ages 18-21 receive industry specific training and are placed primarily in private businesses to gain the skills and experience needed to climb the career ladder within the company. The program pays for the initial training hours as an incentive for the employer to hire the youth. Must be between the ages of 18-21, reside in Glendale, Burbank or La Cañada and be from a low-income family to qualify for the program.

Applications for both programs will be available starting September 2 at the GYA office and <u>website</u>.
