Next Three Work Boot Meetings Announced





Conceived in 2015, "Work Boot Tuesday" enables City Council and residents the opportunity to experience critical City systems and programs firsthand. The first meeting of the season will be held on August 16 at 3:45 pm at the Glendale Police Department's Community Room.

Police Safety: In the face of recent terrible events surrounding public safety around the world, the Glendale Police Department will be holding the first "Work Boot" meeting of the new school year on August 16th to engage with and reinforce our partnership with the community - especially in the areas of use of force and conflict de-escalation. The City Council and Glendale Police Department understand that only through strong community support and participation can we reduce crime, increase empathy and improve safety for all residents and visitors. By continuously improving performance and accountability, improving responsiveness to community needs, and improving quality of life for all residents through innovative policing practices and partnerships, Glendale is one of the safest cities for its size in the country.

Emergency Communication: Have you ever thought about what goes on in an emergency communications center? Who is on the other end of that frantic call? Have you ever wondered about how the information from that call accurately makes its way out into the field? If you are interested in taking a class about how the 9-1-1 system works, you should join us for the second "Work Boot" meeting of the semester on September 27th. In this session, we will focus on the inner workings of both the Police Dispatch Center and Verdugo Fire Communications Center. Learn about how the dispatch centers receive high-pressure phone calls, determine the situation in seconds, identify locations of each emergency, and communicate the critical information to firefighters, paramedics, and police officers.

Fire Safety: The curriculum will continue into the month of October with a "Work Boot" meeting featuring the Fire Department. California's climate is always inviting the devastating danger of wildland fire, and it is important to review and be aware of the steps that are undertaken by our Fire Department personnel in the face of a fire emergency. Be it a wind-driven wild fire or an engulfed apartment building, each incident presents its own set of challenges, but one thing always remains consistent in Glendale - our personnel's commitment to safely and aggressively attack each situation to preserve life and property. In August 2012, the City adopted the Bicycle Transportation Plan (BTP) to encourage cycling as a mode of transportation, while abiding by the State and Federal guidelines for bicycle planning. The goals of the plan are to provide a convenient, useful, and interconnected bicycle transportation system that serves bicyclists. A variety of measures have been implemented including the improvement of existing bicycle facilities, construction of new bike routes linking major activity centers, the installation of secured parking equipment, and the expansion of bicycle education and advocacy programs to improve the riding environment for bicyclists.

Fast forward to today; the <u>Construction of Bicycle Facilities and Citywide Bikeway and Pedestrian Improvements Project</u> is complete. The project included the first ever green bike lane on Sonora Avenue! Additional improvements include the installation of a bikeway with bike route signage and shared roadway (sharrow) pavement markings, rectangular flashing beacons, bicyclist wayfinding signs, pavement repairs, and construction of ADA compliant curb ramps.

LED Lighting Upgrades

Public Works has installed LED lighting technology in three public parking structures in the downtown area, 20 surface parking lots, the Police Department Parking Garage, Larry Zarian Transportation Center, and the Glendale Community College. LED lights will improve safety, security, efficiency, aesthetics, and reduce the overall cost of operation. By incorporating LED lights, the annual energy consumption will be reduced by about 83%, saving Glendale approximately \$200,000 annually. Plus, the newer lighting increases the life expectancy of the system to 7-20 times longer than the previous lamps. Next time you park in one of the structures or lots, will you notice the energy saving difference?

Let's Get to School Safely

Everyone plays a role in getting students to school safely, so as the school year begins, each of us should do our part. Parents should learn the school drop-off routes and teach their children how to safely cross the street. Remind children that all nine Glendale fire stations and the Glendale Police Department are designated Safe Zones.

Students should use crosswalks and bike paths when heading to and from school. Students should ALWAYS wear a helmet and avoid using headphones and/or cellphones which may distract them. Motorists should be extra cautious when driving around schools, drive the stated speed limit, and remember that when a school bus has their red lights flashing, motorists must STOP. Motorists need to be aware that this signals children are getting off the bus and may run across the street. By working together, parents, students, and motorists can ensure students make it to school safely.
