# MESSAGE FROM SCOTT OCHOA



This past weekend, pre-Christmas/Hanukah/Kwanzaa holiday shoppers enjoyed some post-Thanksgiving holiday sales. With Black Friday and Small Business Saturday, Glendale shoppers generated much needed sales tax for the City! What exactly is sales tax? In Los Angeles County, sales tax is 9% and cities receive 1% of that total rate. So, for every dollar spent in Glendale, the City receives about one cent.

Because Glendale is a regional retail shopping destination and the immense draw of <u>Brand Boulevard of Cars</u>, the City is projected to collect \$39,842,000 in sales tax for the 2015-2016 fiscal year. This accounts for 5.0% of the City's total budget. Sales tax revenues are added to the City's General Fund and pays for services such as police, fire, paramedics, parks and recreation, and libraries.

As shoppers consider where to continue their shopping this holiday season, the <u>Glendale Galleria</u> and <u>Americana at Brand</u> offer a wide array of retail stores from Nordstrom, Bloomingdales, and Macys to GAP, Zara, and H&M. Glendale also boasts a number of quaint shopping districts including <u>Kenneth Village</u>, <u>Montrose Shopping Park</u>, <u>Downtown Glendale</u>, Sparr Heights, Adams Square, and the Foothill area of La Crescenta. These destinations have plenty of specialty gift stores to find unique gifts for all!

Be fire safe while decking the halls this holiday season. Pick a Christmas tree with fresh green needles that do not fall off the tree when touched. Place your tree away from heat sources and do not block exits. Water your tree daily. When decorating your tree, use lights that are rated for indoor use, replace any string of lights that are damaged, turn off the tree lights before going to bed and never decorate a tree with candles. Be sure candles are not placed too close to decorations and always blow out candles prior to going to bed.

## **Compost Workshop**

Recycling bottles, cans, and newspapers, helps divert 15-20% of discarded waste from going to landfills, helping maintain the community's beauty. But, recycling leaves, grass, and vegetative food scraps into compost, can divert another 25-30% more! With little effort, you can cut the amount of waste you produce in half! Composting is nature's way of recycling and decomposing organic material into humus, which is a dark, rich soil that provides nutrients to plants and reduces their water requirements. If you have a garden, lawn, trees, shrubs, and planter boxes, you should consider composting!

When attending a compost workshop, the City of Glendale Integrated Waste Management Division provides free compost bins and pitchforks to all Glendale households or building owners responsible for yard maintenance. 
