



Rest assured that staff has been assigned to monitor policy/legal changes and we will be bringing information and opportunities for public input in the coming months. The Glendale City Council's goal is to have an informed & engaged community, and to that end, we have scheduled two community meetings in January to hear from you.

On January 11, we will be holding a community meeting to discuss Prop 64 - to outline the law today, how Prop 64 impacts that law, the anticipated role of the federal government, possible rule/implementation scenarios by the State, and Glendale's range of options.

Additionally, we will be holding a transit mobility summit on January 17th. This "City Council in Your Neighborhood" meeting will include a panel-style discussion with our transit partners. The discussion will include a presentation of where Glendale has been, where we are today, and how our plans for the future of transit in Glendale will be realized. - 3) Place your tree at the curb on your regular collection day.



Short winter days are here! During winter months your landscape does not need to be watered as often due to less sunlight and cooler weather. Even though we are still in mandatory conservation and watering is only allowed on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays, in colder months you can skip a watering day. Below are some other water conservation tips for the winter:

- Water before 9:00 am and after 6:00 pm
- Check your irrigation controllers often due to daylights savings time, resetting by gardeners, or if there is an outage.
- Set your irrigation controllers before leaving town for the holidays.
- Wash only full loads in the washing machine and dishwasher.
- Capture your tap water while waiting for it to warm up and use it to water your plants.

Winter and Holiday Safety



Be fire safe while decking the halls this holiday season.

- Pick a Christmas tree with fresh green needles that do not fall off the tree when touched.
- Place your tree away from heat sources and do not block exits.
- Water your tree daily.
 When decorating your tree, use lights that are rated for indoor use, replace any string of lights that are damaged, turn off the tree lights before going to bed and never decorate a tree with candles.
- Be sure candles are not placed too close to decorations and always blow out candles prior to going to bed.
