MESSAGE FROM SCOTT OCHOA



Glendale City Manager

Over the last few months, we have dedicated considerable time to anticipating potential budget cuts and reductions in service should Measure N, the proposed repeal of Glendale's longstanding Utility Users Tax, muster enough votes to pass. Yet, I think it is also important to outline the City's budget steps should Measure N fail.

Since April, the Mayor and City Council have held several public sessions to discuss goals and objectives for the FY 2016-17 budget, review revenue and expense forecasts, and analyze the City's workflow. Interested residents have participated in the process to advise Council of their interests in selected areas, especially parks/open space, affordable housing needs, code enforcement and historic preservation.





The New & Improved Montrose Shopping Park



The Montrose Shopping district has received beautiful NEW sidewalk litter and recycling containers. The old containers provided a total of 740 gallons of capacity for trash only while the new containers provide 1,024 gallons of capacity for trash AND 1,024 gallons for recyclable material such as cans and bottles. City staff applied for and won a competitive grant from CalRecycle, the State agency that regulates waste management. The grant covers approximately 75% of the cost of the new containers, and the funding comes from the deposit paid on every bottle and can sold within California.





It is critical to have a minimum of three days of food and water for every family member including your pets. In addition it is important to write down all of your important phone numbers including an out of state contact so that you have reference point in case your cell phone breaks and/or cannot be charged. Also, practice driving routes in and out of your neighborhood in case your usual route is blocked. Remember when the ground starts to shake: DROP, COVER and HOLD ON. The Glendale Fire Department wants to encourage our residents to be safe while enjoying the treasures of Glendale. Glendale residents are fortunate to be living in an area where the city meets nature but that also brings potential dangers especially when interacting with wildlife such as snakes. Therefore, take a few precautions to prevent being bitten by a snake: 1. Never go barefoot or wear sandals when walking through wild area. 2. Avoid tall grass, weeds and heavy underbrush where snakes may hide and stick to well-used trails. 3. Never grab "sticks" or "branches" while swimming in lakes and rivers. Rattlesnakes can swim. 4. Never try to hold and/or handle a snake. They will bite. Also, be sure that you bring food, water and a charged cell phone to ensure that you are safe during your hiking experience.
