
As you might presume, achieving and sustaining this balance of wants and resources is not easy, and the Mayor & City Council have labored conscientiously and earnestly as stewards of the public trust. As difficult as it is prioritizing among many worthy projects, programs and needs, they do their level best to diligently and objectively consider outcomes and impacts on people. Make no mistake, as practical as this spending plan is, there are still many more priorities in the community that deserve collective action and attention. Some efforts are largely beyond local control - state mandates governing prison terms, pension costs, the ability (or inability) to effectively provide quality affordable housing, to name but a few. However, to the extent that we believe equally in the concept of value (making sure that the City of Glendale remains a high-performance organization for the benefit of our citizens and customers) and the power of *optimism* (believing that there is reasonable solution for every problem and an equitable response for every challenge), the Mayor and Council have charged the Management Team and staff with developing networks and relationships beyond our city departments and finding ways to collaborate with community partners, both public and private. From GUSD and GCC to our local hospitals, community groups and HOAs, to strategic business partners and investors, all of us together are better able to stretch a nearly \$1 billion budget as absolutely far as possible.

To be sure, relationship building and multi-benefit solutions are extremely complex and rarely are they fast-moving - if they were, then private industry would have already cornered the market. Equitable governance is difficult and multifaceted. Yet if we can commit to these concepts and try our best to wade through the nuance in search of both-win solutions and/or learn how to disagree agreeably on everything from






