While everyone is wondering how we're already 5 months into the year, we are prepping to close out the fiscal year and begin the New Year on July 1<sup>st</sup>. However, before counting down from 10 and popping confetti poppers, comes the budget adoption process and City Council reorganization.

In Glendale, five councilmembers are elected at large to serve four year terms. And, more recently, with the passage of Measure L, Councilmembers may not serve more than three terms. Each year, Council also selects one member to serve as mayor (decided upon at



The highly anticipated and reimagined Downtown Central Library is pleased to announce the reopening of its doors with a ReflectSpace: a new exhibition space designed to explore and reflect on major human atrocities, genocides and civil rights violations. Immersive in conception, ReflectSpace is a hybrid space that is both experiential and informative, employing art, technology and interactive media to reflect on the past and present of Glendale's communal fabric and interrogate current-day global human rights issues.

The inaugural exhibit, called *Landscape of Memory: Witnesses and Remnants of Genocide*, unfolds in two distinct, but interconnected parts, and reflects on the Armenian Genocide through the cross-disciplinary work of witnesses, survivors, and artists, across four generations. ## Infrastructure Week & National Public Works Week

The City of Glendale's pavement condition was recently rated with an average of 73.8 on a scale of zero to 100 on the <u>Pavement Condition Index</u>, whereas the average condition of California's streets are 65. In an effort to maintain Glendale's rating, the City sent letters of support for AB 1 and SB 1, proposals that would help generate more than two billion dollars annually for California's highway system and local streets and roads.


