It's springtime, the flowers are blooming, and our days are brighter, which only means one thing...budget season is in full swing here in Glendale (okay, not the only thing, but I digress...)

It's the time of year when your Glendale City Council and staff work together with the community to propose and adopt Glendale's budget for the coming year. Admittedly, it's a dry topic, but a very important one, because every City expenditure is provided for in the budget – everything from funds for employee salaries to buying equipment, from trash service to providing parks programming, for maintaining facilities to repairing streets.

The budget becomes the outline for how we spend money for all programs and services in areas

### **Councilmember Sinanyan Selected as Mayor**



On Tuesday, April 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2018, Councilmember Zareh Sinanyan was selected as the new Mayor by fellow Council Members. Glendale Council Members are elected by the public at large, while the Mayor is selected by the Council Members on an annual basis. Glendale Council Members serve four-year terms with an election cycle every two years.

Mr. Sinanyan was elected to the Glendale City Council in April -2013, and has been directly involved with the City of Glendale as a past Commissioner on the Community Services & Parks Commission, as well as past Chair and Commissioner of the Community Development Block Grant Advisory Committee. He currently serves as Chair of Eco-Rapid Transit, Vice-President of the Burbank-Glendale-Pasadena Airport Authority, Board Member of the Metropolitan Water District, and Member of the Southern California Association of Governments' Transportation Committee.

Mayor Sinanyan and his wife Lori Sinanyan have been married for 18 years. They have 4 children, three of whom are students at Mark Keppel Magnet such as public safety, libraries, community services, and housing, as well as employee salaries to name a few. How do we pay for these expenses? Well, glad you asked. Revenue raised through different kinds of taxes, fees for services, and categorical grants for specific programs or services received from the state and federal governments.

The city is also required to balance its budget each year. We adjust either revenues or spending plans, or both, in order to do so. The Adopted Budget covers one fiscal year (FY), which in Glendale begins on July 1st of each year and ends on June 30th of the following year.

That being said, we invite our residents to learn more about the budget process and what's in store for the upcoming fiscal year. We will be holding multiple meetings throughout the months of May and June, which will give community members a look at the proposed FY 2018/2019 budget. Each meeting will be held at Glendale City Hall in the Council Chambers located at 613 E. Broadway, Suite 220.






increased risk for these catastrophic fires where homes and buildings extend into the natural, undeveloped hillsides and canyons. Fortunately, the risk to homes and buildings can be substantially reduced if the surrounding vegetation is maintained to minimize the intensity and spread of wildfire. The areas of increased risk for catastrophic fire in the City are designated as 'High Fire Hazard Areas' and every year, Fire Department staff inspect all of the properties in these areas to ensure that the nearby vegetation does not present a fire

The Glendale Fire Department is introducing a new tool that will improve the ability of Fire Department personnel to inspect properties and notify property owners when hazardous conditions exist. This new tool is centered on a cloud-based software suite that automates the entire vegetation management inspection program with tools that allow Fire Department personnel to plan, schedule, and provide notice of vegetation management inspections from a mobile device in the field.

The cost associated with the administration of the new software will be offset by property owners located within the High Fire Hazard areas of the City. Those property owners who are responsible for the new \$15 annual fee will be receiving an invoice in the mail from the Fire Department this month, along with the annual notice to maintain hazardous vegetation around properties. 



# ReflectSpace: Nonlinear Histories Transgenerational Memory of Trauma



This exhibition featured at the Downtown Central Library- 222 East Harvard

Revolving around the idea of postmemory, a concept developed by renowned literary and cultural critic Marianne Hirsch, Nonlinear Histories probes memories and narratives transmitted in the wake of trauma: the process of the individual and collective ownership of trauma, and the collision of personal, national and cultural memories. Prosperity, Loss, and Survival: A Photographic Journey from the Dildilian Family Archive, in the Downtown Central Library PassageWay, is a concurrent exhibition that employs family memoirs and historic photographs from the Dildilians, a family of renowned Armenian photographers.
