Have you ever considered how convenient it is to flip a switch or turn a faucet and have instant services?

It seems simple; you get hungry, you grab food from the fridge and heat it up in the microwave; stressful day at work, you go for an evening walk or take a shower; interested in what is going on around the world, you power up your desktop. But how does all of this actually happen?

These simple pleasures are a crucial part of our lives that we take for granted. Glendale Water and Power (GWP) has been providing and improving upon these necessary and dependable water and electric systems for

decades – and we have come a long way since the beginning. Today GWP serves over 34,000 water and 88,000 electric customers.

Being one of the first utilities to install both electric and water advanced meters, GWP continues to develop and implement new and innovative plans to offer a modernized utility. We continue to improve our electric grid and water system through upgrades that will strengthen our ability to meet demand, maintain reliability and efficiency, save water, and increase the amount of renewable energy. For example, during the FY 2016-17 reporting year, GWP's energy efficiency programs saved 18,842 MWh and reduced peak demand by 2 MW. Additionally, GWP has a long history of supporting renewable energy by providing over 20% of our energy requirements from renewable resources on an annual basis. These types of improvements minimize costs, help customers lower their bills, and reduce environmental impacts.

GWP has earned the prestigious Platinum Level Reliable Public Power Provider (RP3) designation which indicates that our service and safety standards meet high industry principles of reliability. We have also been named as one of a select group of utilities with the most storage to the grid in 2017, earning a spot on the annual Top 10 utility industry lists compiled by the Smart Electric Power Alliance (SEPA).

Over the years, our customers have known that they can also count on having excellent water quality and water reliability. We deliver about 7 billion gallons of safe drinking water annually and continue to operate the system day and night with greater than 99.9% reliability. Each year, we identify certain pipes that need cleaning and relining or replacement to improve water quality, increase pressure, and minimize leakage. In the next few years, our focus will be on replacing aging pipes, cleaning and lining pipes to increase reliability in water delivery, and new well development to rely less on imported water.

Najarian was first elected to office in April 2005. During his tenure, he has served as Chair of the Glendale Housing Authority, and the former Glendale Redevelopment Agency.

"I'm truly grateful for the opportunity to serve as Mayor," said Mayor Najarian. "I look forward to working closely with my Council colleagues and staff to keep Glendale the special place that it is."

In addition to serving on the City Council, Najarian is past chair and a current member of the Los Angeles Metropolitan Transit Authority (MTA) Board of Directors, and a vice-chair of the Southern California Regional Rail Authority (Metrolink) Board of Directors. He is also past chair and a member of the San Fernando Valley Council of Governments and serves as a member of the Southern California Association of Governments Transportation Committee. Najarian previously served as a member of the Glendale Community College Board of Trustees from 2003-2005.

He is an attorney and has a bachelor's degree in economics from Occidental College and Juris Doctor degree from the University of Southern California. He is married to Palmira Perez-Najarian, and has two adult children, Alexander and Christopher.

In order to continue providing high quality services, we are in the process of preparing an Integrated Resource Plan (IRP) and holding scoping meetings for the Proposed Biogas Renewable Generation Project's Draft Environmental Impact Report. Your opinions and comments during these processes are vital for us to gather feedback related to GWP's power supply mix. ## Two Scoping Meetings Scheduled for Proposed Biogas Renewable Generation Project's Draft Environmental Report





The purpose of the Scoping Meetings is to inform the public that the lead agency (Glendale) is evaluating a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and to solicit public comments regarding the type and extent of environmental analyses to be undertaken.

The Biogas Renewable Generation Project will generate approximately 12 megawatts of renewable green energy for the City of Glendale on a three-acre portion of the City landfill. The Proposed Project would beneficially utilize the naturally recurring landfill gas locally without having to transport the gas offsite. This naturally occurring renewable fuel will generate electric energy for local consumption. 


