A Message From Yasmin Beers



Glendale City Manager

It's officially the month of December and we are rounding out the calendar year. Wow! How time flies.

This is the time of year we start decorating for the holidays, spend quality time with family and friends, and reflect on the past year. As you all know well, it's difficult to find a free moment to stop and really think about all of the accomplishments, challenges, and goals you face or set for yourself. Although everyone is living a busy life with work, family, school and other responsibilities, this is a good time to take a moment to reminisce - it's important to regularly look back at our lives and remember the blessings we have been given. Whether you had a successful year or faced challenge after challenge, your ability to move forward and let go of the negativity is what really matters. What truly defines us is what we learn in the process.

For me, 2018 is the year that I was appointed City Manager - I am humbled and thankful for the opportunity to serve this great community. During this past year, Glendale faced some challenges, but also saw many accomplishments.

Rent Freeze



On November 27, 2018, the Glendale City Council adopted an ordinance ("Ordinance") imposing a 60-day rent freeze. The rent freeze commences on December 27, 2018 and expires on February 27, 2019 ("Rent Freeze Period").

Generally, for tenancies commencing on or prior to September 18, 2018, the Ordinance will require landlords of multifamily units to limit the rents they charge during the Rent Freeze Period to no more than the rent they were charging for a unit on September 18, 2018. Any rent increases imposed during the Rent Freeze Period may not exceed 5% of the rent in effect on September 18, 2018. For tenancies commencing after September 18, 2018, rents may not exceed the rent at initial tenancy and any rent increase is subject to the same 5% limitation during the Rent Freeze Period. The landlord must comply with the notice requirements of state law to impose any rent increase.

Example: If a landlord was charging rent of \$1,000 per month for a unit on September 18, 2018 and a rent increase went into effect for that unit on October 1, 2018 for \$1,200 per month, the landlord must roll back the rent during the Rent Freeze Period to \$1,000 per month. The landlord may increase the rent during the Rent Freeze Period by as much as 5% resulting in a new maximum rent of \$1,050/mo., provided it has given notice as required by state law.

Among others, the Ordinance exempts the following from the rent freeze:

- Single Family Homes
- Condominiums or Townhomes
- Rental units that received a Certificate of Occupancy on or after February 1, 1995

Unless extended, the Ordinance and the Rent Freeze expire on February 27, 2018.

The Council also directed City staff to prepare a right to lease ordinance which will include a requirement for landlords to offer tenants a one-year lease, non-binding hearings for certain rent increases, and the right for the tenant to receive relocation if rent increases exceed a specified percentage per year.

Waste Collection Services During the Holidays and Christmas Tree Collection

Our community continues to be one of the safest cities of its size in California and in the nation. That's no small feat. Looking back, our Glendale Police and Fire Departments continue to keep us safe - from making successful arrests and being named SWAT team of the year to safely delivering a baby in a dangerous situation and continuously working side-by-side to ensure preparedness in any circumstance.

This year also brought about new leadership. We swore-in a new Police Chief, appointed a new Assistant City Manager, Library Director, and Chief Information Officer. I can say with confidence that they have demonstrated a successful transition.

The Economic Development team worked to reduce office and retail vacancy rates through increased attraction efforts and proactive business services. There have been a number of new businesses added to the Glendale roster including Rockbird, Heritage Eatery, Five Guys, Cauldron Ice Cream, Gold's Gym, Hyatt, Laemmle Theatre and Lofts, and many more! Glendale's office vacancy rate is at 11.3%, while its retail vacancy is at 1.7%.

On October 2nd, City Council celebrated naming a portion of Maryland to Artsakh Avenue. But it doesn't end here. Plans are currently underway to reconfigure the street to enhance the experience in the Arts and Entertainment District, which may include extended sidewalks, art displays, and improved placemaking elements. Visit now, and you'll get to experience the new holiday decorations!

Additionally, your Glendale Water and Power Department earned the Platinum Level Reliable Public Power Provider (RP3) designation from the American Public Power Association (APPA) for providing reliable and safe electric service. GWP was also ranked 5th in the Country for its Battery Energy



Waste collection services will *not* be provided on Christmas Day, December 25, 2018 or New Year's Day, January 1, 2019. During this time, residents should place containers out the day after their normal collection day (except for those whose pickup is normally on Monday). Tuesday will pick up on Wednesday, Wednesday on Thursday, Thursday on Friday, and Friday on Saturday.

Christmas tree recycling will begin on January 2, 2019 and run through February 16, 2019. Remember to remove all decorations, including ornaments, lights and tinsel. Please cut trees more than 8 feet tall in half. If the tree is cut into small pieces, it may fit in your yard trimmings container. Place the tree at the curb on your regular collection day. If possible, a crew will pick up the tree within a few days. However, when demand is extremely high, service can take up to two weeks, so please be patient.

Staying on the topic of sustainability, Glendale received its 10th Growth Award by the National Arbor Day Foundation, which distinguishes Glendale as a Sterling Tree City USA; this makes Glendale one of only 14 cities in the State of California with that designation.


This past year, Community
Services and Parks completed a
number of improvements at Brand
Park: the Friendship Garden at
the tea house, refurbishment of
the day camp area, improvements
and repairs to the Seven Trees
Trail, as well as installation of
picnic tables throughout the park.

Among our successes this year are Council's efforts to continue to provide affordable housing. We broke ground at the site of Vista Grande Court, the all-new affordable senior apartment complex at 5th and Sonora that will offer 65 homes for seniors, and opened a lottery application for 31 affordable housing units.

As of November 30, Library, Arts and Culture completed their 16month process of electronically tagging, also known as RFID, an estimated 500,000 publicly available items in our collections. RFID uses electromagnetic fields to automatically identify and track books and other owned materials. These tags enable library patrons to checkout multiple items at self-service kiosks simultaneously, giving them a quick and convenient experience at all of our library locations.

Just a few months ago, Public Works also completed construction of the Riverside Drive and Western Avenue Rehabilitation Project near the City's western boundary. The project limits were Riverside Drive from Rancho Avenue to South Chavez Street, and Western Avenue from Victory Boulevard to Rancho Avenue. This included reconstruction of curbs, sidewalks, ADA ramps, and driveway aprons; slurry sealing and resurfacing of the pavement surface; and traffic signal modifications at the intersection of



The program began Saturday, December 1, 2018 and will continue through Sunday, March 31, 2018. To be eligible for this program, individuals must be 18 years and over, and be experiencing homelessness. Please be aware, some locations do not allow walk-ins, individuals must call for accommodations.
