The Importance of Grayson Repowering

A Comprehensive Plan to Provide Local, Reliable, Renewable, and Cost-Effective Energy Today and into the Future of life in your community and Glendale overall.

For example, the Community Services and Parks Department is hosting a series of community meetings to better understand what residents envision for the future of Verdugo Park. The purpose of the initial meeting held on June 17, 2017 was to listen, engage, and note down suggestions, while the upcoming meeting on March 5, 2018 will be to discuss and hear your thoughts about the options developed. We encourage your attendance.

We also hope you will get involved in some of the major planning efforts in the City over the course of the next year. One of our significant efforts in 2018 is the South Glendale Community Plan, which will be the official guide for the neighborhoods and commercial districts in Glendale south of the 134 Freeway, including the Downtown Specific Plan. The 60day public review period for the DEIR is open through March 12, 2018, while a special joint meeting of the Planning Commission and Transportation and Parking Commission has been scheduled for March 7th. We encourage you to attend the public meeting and/or to present written comments. Your voice is important to the future of Glendale.

We will continue to provide opportunities to participate and to deliver transparent information that is accessible to everyone. Your City Council knows that access to information is a fundamental part of civic engagement, but also that just releasing information is not enough. The expectation for providing such information is that our residents will use it to educate themselves about current affairs and have meaningful participation in the conversation.



How The Proposed Project Will Work

All but one of Grayson's power-generating units will be demolished and replaced with new, cleaner, and more efficient units to meet Glendale's power needs. The modern units will have the flexibility to turn on and off quickly and to provide reserve energy to support increasing amounts of solar and renewable energy.

The Need

The proposed Grayson Repowering Project means reliable energy in Glendale. This past summer, Glendale set a new record high for power usage of 350 MW per day. With only 20% of Grayson Power Plant currently in use due to old and aging infrastructure, Glendale barely avoided rolling blackouts. Our community needs Grayson to run efficiently in order to meet the current and future energy needs of Glendale.

The need to repower Grayson is also an environmental one. Per the Clean Energy & Pollution Reduction Act (SB350), Glendale Water and Power will be required to obtain 50% of its energy from renewable sources by 2030. GWP already obtains 47% of its energy from renewable sources. Repowering will allow Glendale to import more renewable and carbon-free energy. It will also allow Glendale to support local solar generation to create a cleaner and environmentally-friendly Glendale.

The Benefits

Four years of hard work have gone into making the Grayson Repowering Project a comprehensive plan to revamp our power plant and provide the best reliable service to Glendale Water & Power customers.

- Lowering long run costs for ratepayers
- Investing in new renewable and carbon free energy technologies that replace high-maintenance, aged infrastructure





She was born in Glendale, became a graduate of Crescenta Valley High School, and then went onto Loyola Marymount University to receive her BS in Biology with a minor in Biochemistry. Michelle attended Michigan State University and earned an MS in Forensic Science with a Forensic Biology concentration. Her thesis examined the feasibility of obtaining DNA profiles from fired cartridge casings. During graduate school, Michelle also interned in the Forensic Biology Unit at the Michigan State Police.

Michelle has been with the Verdugo Regional Crime Laboratory since 2014. She began her career at VRCL as an intern, was hired as a DNA technician, and promoted to a full-time DNA Specialist in 2015. Michelle has worked on approximately 500 cases including a cold case homicide from 1993.



RIISE Project



The RIISE grant creates the Regional Immediate Intervention Service to Employment (RIISE) project, which brings together several community partners to train and prepare participants for full-time employment. RIISE will target individuals that are homeless and are either foster youth, victims of domestic violence, have disabilities, or are receiving government assistance.

The City of Glendale's Continuum of Care, in partnership with Ascencia and other community organizations, will identify and refer candidates to the program. The Verdugo Jobs Center (VJC) will provide counseling and career guidance, as well as work readiness workshops to prepare participants for job search. Work readiness also includes training in communication skills, interpersonal skills, conflict resolution, and other skills needed to be successful in the work environment. The City of Glendale's Community Services & Parks Department will provide temporary paid work experience to qualify for future jobs, while earning wages. Individuals will be supervised while working at park sites conducting general park maintenance. The VJC will provide job placement assistance and supportive services, including interview and work clothing, and transportation assistance to secure employment.
