Before we settle in for the MLB All-Star Game and/or Copa de Oro finals...and before we all roll down to Brand Boulevard for Cruise Night, let's keep in mind that it is barely the first week of July and we have already had our first brush fire in neighboring Burbank. High heat, low humidity, the new undergrowth brought by the winter's heavy rains, and just one accident or act of carelessness can have catastrophic consequences. It's in these instances that we appreciate the men and women of the Glendale Fire Department.

With approximately 85% of the 20,000 calls they go on being emergency medical service, is it accurate to think of GFD as a "fire" department? Make no mistake, modern construction and engineering. technology and fire science, building inspection and safety codes have drastically reduced the risk of structure fires. And while Glendale features many older apartment buildings that don't enjoy the built-in fire protection of new buildings, the Glendale Fire Department personnel have been very effective even here in keeping small fires small. A lot of credit has to go to the unsung heroes in the Fire Prevention Bureau and our inspection programs, as well as to the Mayor and City Council for funding GFD at a level that allows a minimum of four personnel on each engine and ladder truck. But like the dam or levee that is engineered to withstand the "100-year flood", so too is our fire department organized around the principle of managing any incident long enough to deliver the requisite response to avoid loss of life, minimize loss of property and beat back the potential for disaster.

At any time of the day or night, 365 days a year, there are a minimum of 12 fire captains, 12 engineers, 25 paramedics and firefighters on duty - not to mention a cadre of hourly ambulance operators stationed strategically at nine stations around town (and supported by our 911 dispatchers). This allows us to keep a team of paramedics in every station district in the City and it allows us to deliver an appropriate response to make the initial attack on any incident - from fire to HazMat to mountain rescue to EMS. And this is essential to the mission because, in our system of regional mutual aid and as we saw in the recent Burbank brush fire, the initial attack is key to both saving lives and containing the incident until additional resources - up to and including significant air support/water drops - can be mobilized and arrive on scene. To this end, GFD is organized and staffed not so much to address the assorted 17,000 EMS calls per year, as much as being able to handle that call load as well as the 2,000 or so fire calls that demand a force appropriate response.

I recently had lunch with a resident of our community and he asked me, "What keeps you

up at night?" I thought for a second because the list is rather long; however, I had to say that major brush fire is the type of ever-present risk that worries me most: this threat that is not necessarily dependent on human action or error, is able to be spread by forces beyond our control like wind and weather, and if not contained early on could draw resources from the entire region and/or state for an extended period of time. This is why GFD, as well as GPD, Public Works, GWP and other City departments train so hard in preparing for and responding to brush fire incidents. It's also why we focus on education and outreach to local residents and property owners - truly, preparation and mitigation are important factors. Still, I believe that our residents and businesses know that the best insurance policy for our families, homes and properties is a Class One-rated Glendale Fire Department - regardless of whatever name we call it by.

Thus, before you heat up the coals, or plop into the easy chair, or enjoy Cruise Night, take a minute to think about what you can do to improve safety and reduce fire risk, and take minute to send a positive thought to the folks at GFD.



Every year, late in the spring and early summer, West Nile Virus (WNV) reappears. WNV is spread largely through mosquito contact with humans, but also through diseased birds and other means. While for most people contracting WNV is harmless, it can in some cases, cause severe illness or even death. That's why it's important to keep informed about how to protect yourself from WNV.

Fortunately, the Greater Los Angeles County Vector Control District (GLACVCD) tracks confirmed samples and cases of WNV in Los Angeles County, and the first case of the year occurred in Long Beach in mid-June. To protect yourself and help prevent transmission of WNV and other mosquito-borne illnesses, follow these tips:

- Check for and eliminate standing water on your property weekly, and report standing water you see in other locations.
- Avoid outdoor activities at dusk and dawn when mosquitos are most active.
- Wear long pants and long sleeves when outside as much as possible.
- Use insect repellents with EPA-certified repellents, including DEET, oil of lemon eucalyptus, Picaridin, or IR3535.
- Be aware of the potential for other mosquito-borne illnesses when traveling.
- Check all windows and screens in your home to make sure they properly seal.
