# Final EIR for the Proposed Grayson Repowering Project

Nevertheless, these expectations enjoyed by our community are best met if they are periodically evaluated and improved upon. Your City Council and staff recognize that the lack of such services and facilities can diminish your quality of life. With that, one of the trickiest problems we face today as we address the future of our community is the increase in illegal dumping and bulky items placed along sidewalks and alleyways throughout Glendale. Please be assured that as Glendale residents ourselves, City Council and staff empathize with you on the issue of illegal dumping. We have heard your concerns and have seen the problem intensify first-hand.

Of course, significant and vexing problems such as this call for new solutions. From Fiscal Year 2015/16 to Fiscal Year 2016/17, there was a 20% increase in the number of bulky item stops Citywide. Furthermore, through the 2nd Quarter of FY 2017/18, the City completed 15,288 bulky item stops. Based on this service level, it is projected that there will be roughly 30,000 total stops in Fiscal Year 2017/18, which would represent a 37% increase from the previous year.

Last year, the Public Works Department experienced success with a pilot program where abandoned items were collected with the assistance of an experienced waste hauling contractor. As a result of this success, your City Council approved the continuation of this program over the next five years to help expedite the removal of items throughout the community. Moving forward, two abandoned item collection crews by way of the contractor will supplement the City's own in-house bulky item collection crews with service eight hours a day, five days a week.



Glendale Water and Power has published the Final Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for the Proposed Grayson Repowering Project. The Final EIR evaluates the environmental impacts of the proposed project located at 800 Air Way, Glendale, CA 91201. In accordance with CEQA regulations, the Final EIR details any significant impacts the proposed project might have, and, if possible, how the City will mitigate them.

The Final EIR is going to be presented to City Council at the regularly-held meeting on April 10th at 6:00 p.m. The proposed project consists of the demolition of most of the existing power generation facilities at the site, and replacement with new, more efficient, reliable, and cleaner power generation facilities.

# Chevy Chase Sewer Diversion Project Road Closures



Westbound Chevy Chase Drive will be closed between San Fernando Road and the railroad tracks along the boundary with the City of Los Angeles for approximately 3 weeks beginning on February 20. Automated messaging signs will be posted on San Fernando Road both north and south of Chevy Chase Drive,, as well as on Chevy Chase Drive. Traffic traveling westbound on Chevy Chase Drive from Glendale to Los Angeles will be redirected to San Fernando Road, Los Feliz Road, and either Perlita or Brunswick Avenue to get around the construction area. ### **New Vegetation Management Program**



A critical piece in the prevention of catastrophic wildfires in the City is the proper and timely maintenance of the hazardous vegetation that surrounds our homes and the community. The Glendale Fire Department is introducing new technology to aid Fire Department personnel in their inspections of properties in high fire hazard areas of the City and to help streamline the notification process when hazardous conditions are found.

The core of this new technology is a cloud-based software suite that automates the entire vegetation management inspection program. This software includes tools that will allow Fire Department personnel to plan, schedule, and provide notice of vegetation management inspections from mobile device while in the field.

The cost associated with the administration of the new software will be offset by property owners located within the High Fire Hazard areas of the City. Those property owners who are responsible for the new \$15 annual fee will be receiving an invoice in the mail from the Fire Department in April, along with the annual notice to hazardous vegetation around properties.


