

In January of this year, the Council unanimously approved the Glendale Tech Strategy, which called for specific recommendations including creating an accelerator, improving marketing efforts, and encouraging greater collaboration between the companies in Glendale.

Glendale is currently home to 40,000 tech jobs and 1,049 tech companies. The Glendale Tech Strategy -- including the Tech Week and Job Fair -- will bolster this robust sector with even more talent and opportunity.

Summer is winding to a close, but the City of Glendale is still buzzing with outdoor fun. Warm weather or not, the outdoors bring with it mosquitoes – a bug that can ruin any backyard barbecue.

A mosquito's bite can leave more than just itchy bumps. Some mosquitoes carry and transmit serious illnesses like West Nile Virus. Although the City works closely with the Greater Los Angeles Vector Control District (GLACVCD) to control the mosquito population, GLACVCD and Los Angeles Department of Public Health have confirmed more than three mosquito samples from traps to be positive for West Nile Virus and eight human cases of the virus in Glendale.

These numbers, in addition to data from other cities in the region, represent an infection rate that is higher than the 5-year average, although mosquito

abundance is well below the 5-year average.

Prevent the Spread of the Hepatitis A Outbreak in Los Angeles County





The Los Angeles Department of Public Health declared a local outbreak of hepatitis A (HAV) on September 19.

Ten cases of this type of the virus, which causes acute liver disease, have been confirmed. The ten cases are associated with homeless populations, active drug users, and those that provide services and support to those individuals.

To help prevent the spread of this virus, Public Health recommends that individuals get vaccinated for hepatitis A; use their own towels, toothbrushes and eating utensils; don't share food, drinks, or smokes with other people; and wash hands with soap and water after using the bathroom, changing diapers, and before preparing, serving or eating food.

Public Health provides hepatitis A vaccines to persons without access to hepatitis A vaccines through a health care provider. The Glendale Public Health Center, a Los Angeles County-operated facility, is located at 501 N. Glendale Ave. and can be reached at (818) 500-5762.
