Message From Scott Ochoa

This summer in Glendale was all about public safety. Who'd a thunk it? - with heat, holidays, and lots of time spent outside summer is prime time for emergencies. This past weekend, more than 7,000 acres of land burned (about 400 acres here in Glendale) in the La Tuna Canyon Fire and tested our community's agility. With no doubt in my mind, our Fire Department fought this fastspreading fire alongside partner agencies to save lives and property. And that they did - No structures were damaged and no one was injured as a result of the flames in Glendale.

The effort did not stop there. It was the Police Department

directing ground units and assisting residents with evacuations and re-housing. It was the Public Works personnel working on traffic signals in order to ensure the general welfare and safety of our community. It was the Glendale Water and Power personnel ensuring the safety of firefighters and community members by arranging to deenergize affected power lines and making sure there was enough water in the reservoirs and pumps to fight the fire. Our CSP staff coordinating shelter and animal care for evacuees. It was our public information staff disseminating critical information to the public and media. It was our Information Services personnel mapping the fire and evacuation areas. And, the most important, it was our community who not only allowed our first responders to do their work with no interference, but provided overwhelming support through donations of food, water, and supplies. Of course, it goes without saying that emergencies often strike without warning. And during this crisis, our community's unity shined. Excellence in service - kudos to everyone.

To that end, making safety a regular topic of discussion in Glendale, as opposed to one we stress only in times of emergency is important. In order to consistently be resilient through unpredictable disasters, I encourage anything that promotes connections within our community. This could be taking a CERT class with your Fire Department, joining a community group, getting to know your neighbors, or taking part in community events and simply meeting your first responders. This will make our community stronger.

It is also a good time to reevaluate our emergency preparedness. Before this weekend, if I were given a mandatory evacuation order, I'm not sure I'd be ready to pack my life into a suitcase. Now, with a fresh reminder of how quickly life can take a turn, I can confidently say that I would be prepared to leave at any given moment with no questions about whether I took the right things. Do yourself a favor, and make this a priority; make emergency preparedness a priority.

We can all agree that disasters are tragedies. However, they can teach us valuable lessons that can lead to policies and practices that reduce the risk of



Public Art Master Plan: Make Your Voice Heard!









New Parking Meters



In 2008, Public Works first installed multi-space parking meters on Brand Blvd. and in downtown parking lots. As many of these meters have reached the end of their useful life, they have been replaced with new digital multi-space meters. Like the older meters, the new meters have a color LCD screen, accept debit and credit card payments, and allow users to extend by phone when a credit card is used. 
