# A Message From Yasmin Beers





As a longtime resident of Glendale, I take great pride in the quality of essential services provided to our community. But what I've realized recently is that it's sometimes hard to imagine the amount of work, human effort, or finances that are needed to provide these types of services, especially when they are received without interruption. We travel on many miles of paved roads every day and rarely think about how much it costs or the number of people it will take to repave it. Or the amount of preparation and coordination it takes to ensure that our City's infrastructure and responders (and I'm not talking only Police and Fire) are ready for a disaster.

While we have managed to balance our budget for the past several years and have consistently met our commitment to providing a good quality of life, there are certain services and programs we have had to demobilize in order to continue providing the essentials.

Achieving a balance of wants, needs, and resources is not easy. As difficult as it is to prioritize projects and programs, we do our best to diligently consider every impact on our community.

### Glendale Fire Chief Announces Retirement



On Tuesday, September 5, 2018, Fire Chief Greg Fish announced his plans to retire after a successful 31-year public safety career with the City of Glendale.

Over the years, Chief Fish has made it a priority to ensure the safety of the Glendale community. Chief Fish has been the incident commander on many significant emergencies and has built long-lasting relationships in the City. He is credited with implementing a comprehensive training video series for the cities of Glendale, Burbank, and Pasadena.

Chief Fish had the privilege of leading 270 sworn and non-sworn personnel and has taken great pride in maintaining a Class 1 Fire Department. As the fourth-largest city in Los Angeles County, the Glendale Fire Department serves an area of 30.7 square miles that is home to about 205,000 residents. The department responds to over 19,000 incidents within the City and other nearby jurisdictions.

Chief Fish will continue to lead the department until September 28, 2018. In order to ensure a smooth leadership transition, Deputy Chief Bill Lynch and Deputy Chief Silvio Lanzas will be appointed to the position of Interim Fire Chief consecutively before proceeding with the hiring of the position.

Deputy Chief Lynch's appointment to Interim Fire Chief will be effective September 29, 2018 to November 30, 2018. During this time, Deputy Chief Lanzas will move from his full-time position in the Verdugo Fire Communications Center to the Deputy Chief position overseeing Operations and Emergency Medical Services, with continued supervision of Verdugo. Also throughout this time, Deputy Chief Lynch will continue to oversee Fire Prevention, Training, and Administration.

Deputy Chief Lanzas' appointment to Interim Fire Chief will be effective December 1, 2018 to January 31, 2019. During this time, Deputy Chief Lynch will move back to overseeing Operations, Training, and Fire Prevention. Also throughout this time, Deputy Chief Lanzas will continue to supervise the Verdugo Fire Communications Center, Emergency Medical Services, and Administration.

One prime example is the level of safety in Glendale. In addition to being ranked one of the safest cities of its size in the country, Glendale, with its Police and Fire Departments, has improved its 911 emergency response times between 2016 and 2017. In 2016, Glendale Police on average arrived on scene in 4 minutes and 49 seconds. Last year, GPD trimmed that down to 4 minutes and 3 seconds. For Glendale Fire, emergency medical and fire crews on average responded in 4 minutes and 21 seconds, an improvement of 5 seconds from the previous year. Meanwhile, the state average for public safety agencies is between 5 and 6 minutes. No doubt, we can appreciate the quality of services we, as residents and businesses, receive in the Jewel City. And, you probably didn't even know that to balance our budgets over the past decade we eliminated 337 employees including 40 police officers and firefighters since 2008. Future cuts are just not possible to maintain what we

On that note, it is important to understand that the price of just keeping up with the basics, like maintaining satisfactory 911 emergency response times, increases with each passing year.

enjoy today.

For example, since fiscal year 2011-2012, the cost to replace a sidewalk has more than doubled from \$4.50 to \$10.30 per square foot. During the same timeframe, the cost per lane mile of street slurry sealed increased by over \$11,500.

Another example comes from the Community Services and Parks Department. It would cost about \$2-\$3 million per acre to develop a new park. A neighborhood park renovation, such as one at the 7.9 acre Fremont Park, would cost upwards of \$10 million. The price to construct a mini-park has gone up too. The cost per square foot has greatly increased from \$28 per square foot in 2002 to \$59 in 2013.

And by 2023, due to rising costs, our general fund is expected to face an annual budget deficit of \$6 million. That's why the City is asking voters to consider a sales tax measure to ensure a fiscally

# Public Works Completes the Riverside Drive and Western Rehabilitation Project!



Last month, Public Works completed construction of the Riverside Drive and Western Avenue Rehabilitation Project near the City's western boundary. The project limits were Riverside Drive from Rancho Avenue to South Chavez Street, and Western Avenue from Victory Boulevard to Rancho Avenue. The scope of work included reconstruction of curbs, sidewalks, ADA ramps, and driveway aprons; slurry sealing and resurfacing of the pavement surface; and traffic signal modifications at the intersection of Riverside Drive and Chavez Street. 

- **3. GTV6:** GTV6 will provide all important information about the incident on their public access channel. Watch <a href="here">here</a>.

Emergency Information Center:** This center is only open during large scale emergencies and provides residents with an opportunity to speak with a City employee to get incident specific information. When activated, call (818) 548-3301 the City will inform the public of the activation through its various platforms.


