By the time you read this, it's old news and we've all moved on from it. Still, this is a great opportunity to look back at how Glendale has grown in the last decade

grown from a population of 191,719 (2010 Census) to 205,536 in 2018 (California Department of Finance).

Looking back, there have been numerous achievements that we should all be proud of, as well as some challenges that we continue dedicating our time and efforts to. Since 2009, Glendale has seen a number of improvements and has become a world class city.

In the last ten years, we upgraded a number of our library locations, and completely renovated our two largest libraries - Brand and Downtown Central. These two locations have greatly enhanced the functions of the libraries that are now state-of-the-art facilities for access to information, art, and technology. The restored Brand Library became a historic gem in its park setting, attracting more visitors. And improvements to the Central Library make it a strong anchor to Central Park and the location of the future Armenian American Museum, helping develop a connection to the downtown and arts & entertainment districts.

Additionally, with the founding of new businesses, multi-unit housing developments, and corporations in and around the downtown, Glendale has reached new economic development heights. With added business concierge services, attraction efforts, and tech initiatives, Glendale is now the site of top new companies such as Tesla, Service Titan, Age of Learning, and much more. Now, over 1,029 local high tech firms employ over 40,000 employees, and new hotels such as the Hyatt Place and Hampton Inn are serving thousands of guests. Glendale has also gained a number of new delicious eateries. One of Glendale's shopping destinations, the Americana at Brand, celebrated its 10 year anniversary just last year. The impressive Glendale Galleria, the fourthlargest shopping mall in LA County, also underwent an extensive renovation starting in 2012.

Since 2009, Glendale also saw the renovation of a variety of park spaces and constructed the

Pacific Park Community Pool. In 2010, construction of the Adult Recreation Center, home to the Community Services & Parks Department's senior services section, was also completed.

In the last ten years, Glendale welcomed the new Regional Crime Lab in a new Police Station, which officially opened in April 2012. This new Station and lab modernized the police force and accommodated for growth, while allowing the City and its neighbors to process DNA evidence quicker and more frequently than before.

Despite the economic downturn about 10 years ago, Glendale created and continues to seek affordable housing opportunities – from Doran Gardens to Veteran's Village to ACE/121. These units are fully occupied by very low, low, and moderate income families and persons with special needs.

In addition, Glendale moved towards a Smarter Grid and replaced 120,000 electric and water meters with new technology that provides real-time usage data to customers and helps conserve energy and water in ways that would be impossible with traditional meters.

Of course, in the last 10 years, there have been many more transformations, but the small examples above give a good indication of the great renewal Glendale has seen.

It's All About Trees!



The City of Glendale was awarded the Circle 3.0 grant, and is partnering with West Coast Arborists, Inc. (WCA) and the California Urban Forest Council (CaUFC) through the California Initiative to Reduce Carbon and Limit Emissions (Circle). Circle 3.0 is a grant project funded through CalFire with the goal to reduce carbon and greenhouse gas emissions by planting urban trees.

The Circle 3.0 grant provides 220 trees to the City of Glendale, with 200 new trees to be installed as City street trees and 20 trees selected for the reforestation in Verdugo Park. The grant also makes new trees available for Glendale residents through the Circle 3.0 Community Canopy toolkit. This online


