City Council Adopts 2019-2020 Budget



The Glendale City Council adopted yet another balanced budget at its June 4 meeting. The fiscal year 2019-20 budget takes a long-term sustainability approach that closely monitors cost-drivers and adapts to changes to offer the City structural balance.

The City will continue to aggressively pursue exceptional customer service, balance value propositions, and invest in the future to ensure continuity of high quality City services.

The final budget will be available on the <u>City's website</u> in the near future. Budget documents from recent budget workshops are already available <u>online</u>. A summary of the new budget can be found in the <u>report</u> prepared by the City Finance Department.


Summer is almost here! But wait, is it? Looks like May Grey is giving way to June Gloom...



- Must be between the ages of 16-21

- · Must have right to work documents
- If under 18, must be able to obtain a work permit from school
