Remembering or keeping this information on-hand, and/or following the various platforms ahead of an emergency is critical.

Here's what you should know:

- 1. Everbridge:** Register for important City notifications during large emergencies including information about evacuations, inundation zones,



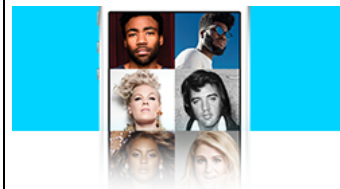

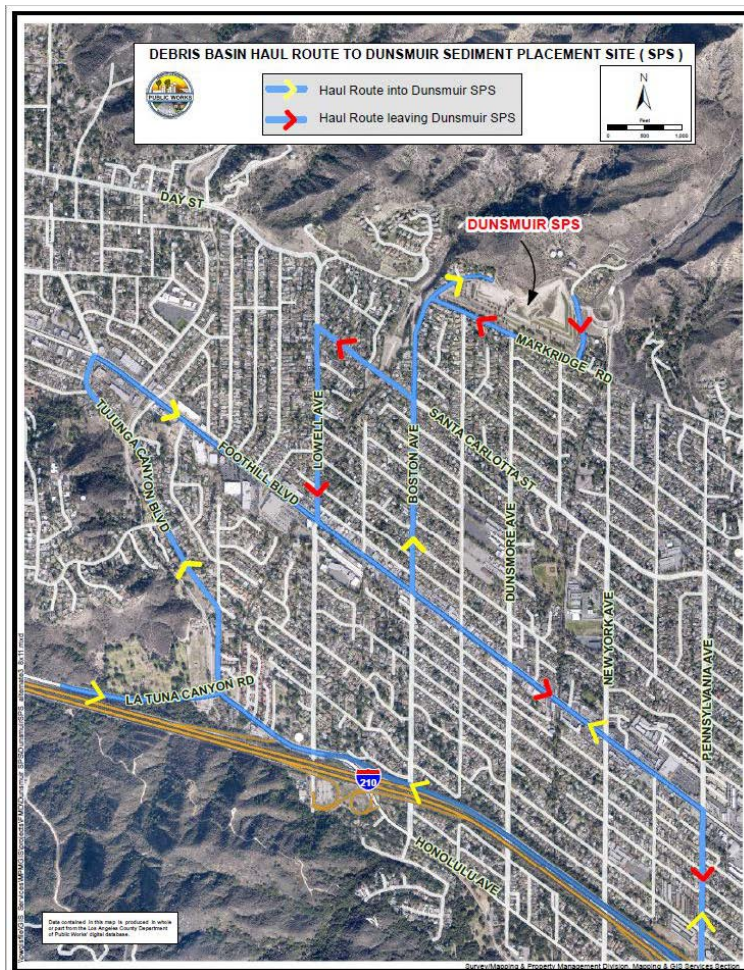

The Glendale Youth Alliance (GYA) has received funding to operate the STEPS 2019 Summer Training and Employment Program for Students with disabilities! GYA is now accepting applications. Youth will receive work readiness training and 200 hours of paid work experience at a worksite based on their skills, aptitudes, and interests during the summer months.

Youth Eligibility:

- Must be between the ages of 16-21
- Must have a disability and be able to work independently in mainstream employment
- Must have right to work documents
- If under 18, must be able to obtain a work permit from school

Most jobs are in the cities of Glendale, Burbank and surrounding areas; therefore, youth must have transportation to work.
