
## City Manager's Message

Glendale Measure S. The program will assist businesses who have 500 or fewer employees with a \$5,000 grant. *This* program closed on July 15, 2020.

• <u>AI Fresco Glendale</u> \$150,000. A program that will provide restaurants and retailers with necessary temporary streetscape equipment to safely designate curbside parking spaces, public right-of-way sidewalks, and private property as temporary outdoor dining locations.



## **Face Coverings**

The City of Glendale continues to take an aggressive approach to the fight against COVID-19 by enacting strict measures for the use of facial coverings. On Tuesday, July 21, 2020, the Glendale City Council affirmed the imposition of fines for those who do not comply with the Public Order to wear a face covering. Previously, the City modified its Face Covering Order originally issued on April 10, 2020 to become one of the first municipalities in the region to require that all persons wear face coverings when leaving their places of residence, employment, or otherwise out in public for essential activities.

Under the Order, businesses can refuse service to any person who does not wear a face covering or fails to comply with social distancing. Businesses must also take all reasonable steps to ensure those in line or entering their business wear face coverings and comply with

physical distancing requirements. The Order also authorizes administrative citations for failing to wear face coverings, for individuals, as \$400 for a first violation, \$1,000 for a second violation, and \$2,000 for a third violation. For businesses, the fines associated with the administrative citation are the same. For more

The Household Hazardous Waste collections facility on 780 Flower St. is open every Wednesday from 9 am to 3 pm for Glendale and La Canada residents to drop off items such as pesticides, batteries, pool and yard chemicals, paints and solvents, cleaning products, aerosol cans, medicines, florescent bulbs and tubes, propane containers and sharps/needles (in approved biohazard container). A maximum of 15 gallons of liquid or 125 lbs. of solid hazardous waste may be dropped off during each visit. It is illegal to dispose of hazardous waste in the garbage, down storm drains, or onto the ground. Chemicals in illegally disposed hazardous waste can be released into the environment and contaminate our air. water, and food. Come by to see us and drop off your Household Hazardous Waste to receive 2 bottles of hand sanitizer bottles for free as our thank you! (while supplies last)

## **GWP Cares Bill Relief Program**

GWP's Cares Bill Relief program is a temporary program that provides a one-time bill credit to eligible residential and commercial GWP electric customers who have been financially impacted by COVID-19. Residential GWP customers who meet income guidelines and have been fired, laid off, furloughed, had their work hours reduced, or lost income may be eligible. Additionally, commercial GWP customers who have been shut down for a period of 4 weeks or more (in the case of dining establishments, closed for consumption on premises), and are not considered to be essential businesses, would be eligible.

One-time bill credits are the following amounts:

- 150 for commercial GWP electric customers
- \$150 for single-family residential GWP electric customers
- \$80 for multi-family residential GWP electric customers
- \$60 for residential low-income GWP electric customers who are enrolled in GWP's Glendale Care or Senior

Care Program. These customers have been automatically enrolled in the program. If you are currently enrolled in the Glendale Care or Senior Care program, please do not submit an application.

See below for income guidelines:

- 1 household member: \$75,000 max annual income
- 2 household members: \$100,000 max annual income
- 3 household members: \$125,000 max annual income
- 4 or more household members: \$150,000 max annual income





## **Beat the Heat at Pacific Community Pool**

The Community Services & Parks Department (CSP) re-opened the Pacific Community Pool on Monday, June 15 after a 3-month closure due to COVID-19. Current programs include lap and recreation swim, as well as swim lessons, which follow the protocols set by the LA County Department of Public Health. There are nine (9) areas of the pool identified for use: six (6) 25-yard lap lanes, one (1) 15-yard lane for recreation purposes, and two (2) shallow end areas for recreation purposes. Up to six (6) swimmers from a single household may use each swimming area at a time, and swim sessions are limited to 50 minutes to provide time for proper disinfection between each session. Sessions start at the top of each hour during open hours of operation, Monday through Sunday. Swimmers are strongly encouraged to make a reservation due to limited space and time available. The schedule will be updated weekly to adjust for changes in the County protocols, and to add in additional programming.

## L.A. County Free Delivery Service for Older Adults

As our seniors practice "Safer at Home" principals, Los Angeles County Workforce Development Aging and Community Services (WDACS) is offering a free delivery program for older adults and individuals with disabilities. This Countywide program, called Critical Delivery Service, will In order to protect the health and safety of our community, and in accordance with guidance from State and local health officials to prevent the spread of COVID-19, Community Services & Parks is continuing to implement the following:

- All sports and recreation areas are closed until further notice. This
  includes, but is not limited to playgrounds, splash pads, picnic tables
  and shelters, fitness equipment areas, basketball courts, skate parks,
  volleyball courts and all fields (baseball, soccer, softball, multi-purpose),
  except as permitted for sports camps/clinics.
- All park buildings and indoor facilities are closed to the public until further notice, including community centers, community buildings, Verdugo Jobs Center, gyms, computer labs, and multi-purpose rooms.
- The City has one indoor gym at the Adult Recreation Center, but it will not open that facility since it is a Senior Center and the County is not allowing for senior congregate programs at this time.
- All events and rentals are cancelled. New reservations are suspended until further notice.
- All in-person recreation programs and classes are suspended/cancelled until further notice, including sports leagues, instructional classes (contract classes), drop-in programs, and recreation activities. Pedestrian Hybrid Beacon (PHB) Project

The City's first Pedestrian Hybrid Beacon (PHB) Project at the Verdugo Road and Oakwood Avenue intersection, adjacent to Glorietta Park, is complete! The PHB is a Federal and State approved traffic control device designed to help pedestrians safely cross busy or higher-speed roadways at midblock and uncontrolled intersections. The beacon consists of two red lenses above a single yellow lens. The lenses remain "dark" until a pedestrian desiring to cross the street pushes the call button to activate the beacon. The signal then initiates a yellow to red lighting sequence consisting of steady and flashing lights, which directs motorists to slow down and come to a stop. The pedestrian signal flashes a WALK then a Don't Walk display to the pedestrian. Once the pedestrian has safely crossed, the hybrid beacon again goes dark. The City has received positive feedback from the community regarding this new, innovative pedestrian safety enhancement.

## Recycle Batteries Today for a Better Tomorrow

Each year Americans throw away more than 3 billion batteries. Unlike compostable trash, batteries are considered hazardous waste. When a battery enters a landfill, the casing can be crushed or easily degrade, which can cause mercury and other toxins to leach into the environment. So, unless you

- **Source Reduction:** Pare down the amount of food purchased, control portions, and reduce excess.
- Feed the Hungry: Whether it's donating the food to a food bank or taking leftovers over to a family member, work to get that food eaten.
- Composting: Send the food scraps to the earth to turn into rich soil.

#### 2. Reduce Plastic Bag Usage

• Use reusable bags instead for all of your shopping needs and keep a supply stored in your car.

#### 3. Reusable Rags and Cloths

• Avoid paper towels, napkins, and tissues by going reusable. After use, simply toss in the laundry.
