

The Latest Buzz: New Glendale Beeline Bus Service Improvements.

Beginning Sunday, November 15, 2020, Glendale Beeline will implement service changes to improve bus service and provide better connections for customers to live, work, and do business in Glendale. Improvements include a new Route 1 operating directly along Central Ave. every 10 minutes; Route 4, extending to the Glendale Transportation Center operating every 10 minutes on weekdays; and new Route 8, connecting Glendale Transportation Center to Glendale Community College via Glendale Ave. There will also be additional schedule improvements on all bus routes.

New schedule and map brochures for all routes are available on all Glendale Beeline buses and at <u>GlendaleBeeline.com</u>. On Tuesday, October 20, 2020, the Glendale City Council adopted a revised Emergency Eviction Moratorium Order aligning the repayment schedule for past due rent with Assembly Bill No. 3088 ("AB 3088"). Under Assembly Bill No. 3088, Glendale's **residential eviction moratorium** was modified to have

City's \$5,000 Small Business Grant Program Opens for Round 2

City Launches Business Association Grant Program

The <u>Business Association Grant Program</u> is designed to assist Glendale business associations that are experiencing COVID-19 financial challenges. Eligible associations will receive a \$15,000 grant to assist with operational costs. The application portal for this grant opened on Wednesday, October 21, 2020 and will close when funds are exhausted. Only 10 grants available; acceptance is on a first-come, first-serve basis.



\$500 Reimbursement Grants Still Available

Glendale businesses may apply for a one-time reimbursement grant for PPE purchases related to COVID-19. The grant is open only to brick and mortar businesses located in commercially zoned Glendale properties. Applications will be accepted until funds are exhausted. Child Care Program During Distance Learning Registration Now open Fall Session Dates: August 19 - December 18, 2020

The City of Glendale, Community Services & Parks Department is here to help you with child care during this fall's distance learning school session with <u>Education Connection</u> distance learning sites and Maple Starz After School Camp, available at five locations for students ages 5-14. Locations are as follows: Civic Auditorium, Dunsmore Community Building, Glenoaks Park (Joe Bridges Clubhouse), Maple Park Community Center, and Pacific Community Center.

There are two programs in operation, concurrently. The first part of the day is called Education Connection: parents are able to drop off their child(ren) from 7:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. at one of the five locations listed above. CSP staff will make sure the children are able to connect to the wireless network and are participating in their remote learning sessions as per their individualized schedules. When the entire pod of 10 to 12 kids is on break, they will be able to participate in various recreational activities. Education Connection is offered at no cost to parents. Participants have to have their own devices, supplies, and lunch.

Maple Starz After School Camp operates from 2:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m., at all sites. The same participants enrolled in Education Connection can also be enrolled into the Camp for a fee of \$55.00 per week, per child for Glendale residents, and \$70 per week, per child for all others. This portion of the day is based on how CSP conducts its seasonal day camp program, and the themes, activities, and games are adapted versions of our recently concluded summer day camp program.

Education Connection and Maple Starz After School Camp are not designed to offer tutoring or homework assistance to the participants. The staff working in the program are existing department staff who work the seasonal camp program and the One Glendale After School Youth Sports Program.

Weekly registration is required. Space is limited, so register early.

New Clean Energy Programs for Glendale Water & Power

On Tuesday, October 13, 2020, the Glendale City Council unanimously approved multiple energy efficiency and demand response programs for Glendale Water & Power (GWP). These clean energy programs include residential and commercial demand response and a direct install of energy efficiency measures for commercial customers. Council also authorized GWP to proceed with negotiations for the development of a residential virtual power plant program.

GWP has been pursuing alternatives for its Grayson Repowering Project in an effort to reduce its reliance on gas generated and imported power. The Clean Energy programs are expected to launch in early 2021, after the contracts are negotiated and finalized. Once fully implemented, the programs are expected to deliver an average peak capacity of 38.4 MW. <u>Click</u> <u>here</u> to learn more about these programs.



Mylar Balloon Ordinance



On Tuesday, October 13, 2020, the Glendale City Council adopted a new Mylar Balloon Ordinance, which prohibits the sale of electrically conductive Mylar Balloons filled with helium or gas lighter than air within city limits. The new ordinance allows only for air filled Mylar Balloons affixed to a decorative structure, such as a post or balloon arch, at the point of sale. This new ordinance stems from many years of power interruptions due to the Mylar Balloons drifting into power lines and causing long outages and damages to GWP's power infrastructure. The new ordinance will take effect on November 13, 2020, will impose administrative citations and fines, and may result in the filing of misdemeanor charges on businesses that sell Mylar balloons inflated with helium or gas lighter than air. Expanded Contactless Pickup Service

On Monday, November 9, Glendale Library, Arts & Culture (GLAC) will expand its successful Contactless Pickup service to Brand Library & Art Center, located at 1601 West Mountain Street, and Montrose Library, located at 2465 Honolulu Avenue. Since June, GLAC has been providing safe, contactless pickup services at the Central Library, making its rich collection of 750,000 physical books, movies and music available to the community while libraries are closed to public access.

Brand Library will offer Contactless Pickup service to patrons with items on hold by appointment only.

• Pickup service will be available Mondays, Tuesdays, and Saturdays from 12:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m. from the Plaza on the west side of the library and next to the accessible parking lot on the east side.

Montrose Library will offer Contactless Pickup service to patrons with items on hold without appointment.

Public Works Department Wins American Society of Civil Engineer's Metro Los Angeles Awards

The American Society of Civil Engineer's (ASCE) Metropolitan Los Angeles Branch 2020 Awards Committee has selected the Kenneth Road Rehabilitation Project for the Outstanding Construction Project. This project was recognized for using exceptional or innovative construction methods and outstanding project management, design, and construction methods to overcome challenges and successfully complete a construction project. The ASCE also awarded the Implementation of the Bicycle Transportation Plan Project, Phase 3 as the Outstanding Bikeways and Trails Project. The Bikeways and Trails Project focused on the enhancement and implementation of new bikeways that improve and promote community connectivity and encourage non-motorized transportation. Additionally, this project won at the ASCE's Los Angeles section level, which had competing projects submitted from the counties of Orange, San Bernardino, Riverside, Kern, and Ventura. - 5. **Decorating:** Use biodegradable products such as pumpkins, pine cones, leaves, and branches to decorate and compost at the end of the season.
- 6. **Leftovers:** Place leftovers in reusable food containers or cloth wraps instead of using plastic wrap, and put it in the fridge to enjoy later.

Street Sweeping Update

Parking enforcement for "No Parking" regulations resumed in residential neighborhoods on October 15, 2020. This regulation assists the City's street sweeping program by removing vehicles to allow the street sweeper to remove dirt and debris from the streets. This not only provides a healthy and safe environment for Glendale residents and visitors, but helps the City meet federal and local mandates, including the Federal Clean Water Act, which require the removal of dirt and debris before they can enter the storm drain system. The street sweeping system also helps identify abandoned/stolen vehicles and allows our crews to perform additional services, such as routine maintenance on streets, curbs, and trees. Please help us keep your streets clean and free of debris by following this regulation.

Did you know that 40 percent of Glendale's trash is organic? Organic materials such as yard trimmings, food scraps and coffee grounds degrade and turn into a valuable soil amendment.
