- City of Glendale Community Services & Parks Department- lead agency and collaborative applicant
- Responsible for the coordination, completion and submission of this annual grant in conjunction with all renewal and new project (if applicable) partners.

2021 CoC Funds

Annual Renewal Demand	\$ 2,661,331 (ARD) Amount needed to fund one year of existing projects eligible for renewal
Tier 1 Amount	\$ 2,661,331
CoC Bonus	\$ 258,272 (recommended- new PSH or RRH projects, SSO- CES demonstrating coordination with housing providers/healthcare organizations)
Domestic Violence Bonus	\$ 133,067 (PSH, RRH or SSO-CES) must meet the comparable data requirements.
CoC Planning Grant	\$ 79,840 (not ranked)

CoC Program Priorities & Performance Measures

Eligible Renewal Projects	Only projects on the approved Grant Inventory Worksheet (GIW), expiring in 2021 are eligible to apply for renewal funds. Renewal applications are not guaranteed funding. All projects are subject to review and scoring. Projects listed on the GIW for the first time cannot be reallocated.
Project Types	Renewal Projects: Permanent Supportive Housing, Rapid Rehousing, Homeless Management of Information System (HMIS), SSO-CES New Projects: Transition Grant, Domestic Violence Bonus, Consolidated Projects, Planning Grant, Reallocated funds for Expansion of Eligible Renewal Projects or New Projects (not including Safe Haven or Transitional Housing).
DV Bonus Projects	<u>New Funds</u> for competitive RRH or Joint (TH+RRH) dedicated to 100% DV participants. Awarded based on local data and response to special NOFO questions.
Tier 2 Scoring	Tier 2 Scoring formula include differences based on project type. The CoC Application score is a major factor in the scoring (50%). <u>All new projects</u>
System Mandates; Return of Housing First Requirement	HMIS, Coordinated Entry System (CES), Housing First and Low Barrier housing approaches, VAWA, and regulatory assurances.
Code of Conduct Updates	Codes of conduct forms compliant with regulatory assurances under 2 CFR part 200 are included the applicant profile and must be on file with HUD.
System Performance Measures	Returns to homelessness; jobs income growth; reduction in the number of first time homelessness, length of time homeless; successful permanent housing placement or retention; bed coverage at least 85%, DV comparable database and HIC count.

2021 CoC Target Population

CoC 2021 PROJECT REVIEW AND SCORING

Total CoC Application Score 163-point scale

Key Performance Measures

- > Reduction in number of homeless persons (at least 5%)
- > Reductions in length of time persons remain homeless
- > Reduction in number of first time homeless
- Successful Permanent Housing Placement or Retention
- > Jobs and income growth (mainly employment sources
- ➤ Bed Utilization (85% and up)

Housing First Approach

 Project entry process that prioritizes rapid placement and stabilization in permanent housing that meets HUD's Housing First criteria

Access to permanent housing without prerequisites or conditions beyond those of a typical renter.

Examples:

- Sobriety is not an entrance requirement
- Medication compliance is not an entrance requirement
- ➤ Agreement to participate in services in not an entrance requirement
- ➤ No minimum income requirement

Racial Equity

Goal: Embed and institutionalize racial equity into all housing programs, strategies and plans!

- Promote equity throughout CoC homeless response system for Black, Indigenous, Hispanic (non-white), and LGBTO who are disproportionally more likely to experience homelessness;
- How is your Agency addressing racial disparities?
- Written Policies and Procedures/Action Plan, strategies to enhance equity in the existing CES system.
- Racial Impact Analysis-Demographics/Performance Data
