COMMERCIAL GENERATOR REQUIREMENTS

Requirements:

Chapter 8.44 of the Glendale Municipal Code (GMC), 1995, requires Tier 1 and 2 businesses to participate in food donation.

Commercial Edible Food Generator:

Tier 1: Supermarket, food service provider/ distributor, wholesale food vendor, or any grocery store with a facility of 10,000 square feet.

Tier 2: Restaurant with 250 or more seats, hotel with onsite food facility, large venue, a state agency cafeteria, and health care facility with 100 or more beds.

Donation Protection:

With the help of the California Good Samaritan Food Donation Act (AB 1219), a person or food facility that donates food is protected from liability or penalty for all donations that are given. As long as the donor makes a good faith that the food you're providing is safe to eat.

This law also protects you from any past due date foods that cannot be consumed anymore.

Instead of throwing away unwanted food items, let's make the world a better place and start donating food to help feed people.
