Study Objectives

Streamline Fee Structures

Consolidate and expand fees where appropriate to better reflect existing services.

Average Time Assumptions

Identify the average level of effort associated with different permits and applications.

Fully Burdened Hourly Rates

Determine direct and indirect costs associated with staff time.

Comparative Survey

Benchmark against other jurisdictions.

Compliance with Prop 218 and 26

Ensure that the current fees do not exceed direct and indirect costs.

Updated Fee Schedule

Provide an updated fee schedule reflective of current costs.

Study Background

- City last conducted a fee study in 2014.
 - Annual CPI Adjustments applied
- It is best practice to conduct a comprehensive update every 3-5 years.
- Current study reviewed all citywide fees for service.
- Comparative Survey was conducted of surrounding jurisdictions for sample of fees from each Department.

Methodology



The methodology is based on a "bottom-up" approach, which is considered the most defensible approach for establishing the full cost.

Fully Burdened Hourly Rates

Salaries & Benefits

- Budgeted Salaries and Benefits assigned at the position level.

Productive Work Hours

- Total available hours subtracting average sick, vacation, holidays, etc.

Services & Supplies Overhead

- Services and supplies such as internal service charges, fuel charges, etc.

Departmental Overhead

- Administration divisions, supervisory, and clerical staff support.

Citywide Overhead

- City Clerk, Finance, Human Resources and other City indirect support.

Cost Recovery Considerations

- No fee can be set at more than 100% cost recovery. Any fees showing over-recovery will need to be reduced.
- Any state or local / ordinance based fees would remain unchanged.
- Fees should be annually updated based upon local CPI per best practices.
- Setting fees at less than 100% cost recovery, means fees are subsidized through other funding sources.
- Typical considerations for lower cost recovery is given to fees that:
 - Encourage compliance (i.e., water heaters, fire prevention permits, etc.)
 - Don't serve as barrier to entry (i.e., appeals, etc.)

CDD – Licensing	Various Animal License related fees	Services are currently contracted out
Community Services & Parks	Various Non-Profit and Commercial Rate fees related to rentals and programs	To simplify the schedule of fees; a reference will be added to the applicable standard rate fees on the fee schedule with a % discount that will be applied for non-profit customers and the rate factor that will be applied for commercial customers meeting a certain criteria
Finance	Budget Book	Available on the City’s website and hard copies are available for review at City library branches
Library	Various Lost/Destroyed Materials and Supplies fees	Deleted to be combined into one single fee
