## **Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO)**

On July 31,2024, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) released the NOFO for the FY 2024 and FY 2025 Continuum of Care (CoC) Funding Competition. This document provides the timeline and a summary of critical information for any non-profits wishing to apply for this funding.

Only projects on the approved Grant Inventory Worksheet (GIW), expiring in 2024 are eligible to apply for renewal funds. Renewal applications are not guaranteed funding. All projects are subject to review and scoring. Projects listed on the GIW for the first time cannot be reallocated.  SSO-CE (for families or youth), PSH, RRH, Joint TH-RRH, or the Expansion of an Eligible Renewal Project.  SSO-CE, or RRH, or Joint TH-RRH project dedicated to 100% DV participants. Awarded based on local data and response to special NOFO questions.  Tier 2 Scoring formula include differences based on project type. The CoC Application score is a major factor in the scoring (50%)
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HMIS, Coordinated Entry System (CES), Housing First and Low Barrier housing approaches, RTFH Written Standards, VAWA, and regulatory assurances.  HUD has clarified the expectations for meeting Housing First requirements for participation in supportive services while residing in CoC programs.
Codes of conduct forms compliant with regulatory assurances under 2 CFR part 200 are included the applicant profile and must be on file with HUD.
Returns to homelessness; jobs income growth; reduction in the number of first-time homelessness, length of time homeless; successful permanent housing placement or retention; bed coverage at least 85%, DV comparable database and HIC count.
The CoC application continues prioritizing:  Promoting racial equity in homelessness and in the local CoC process, building effective workforce, increase housing supply, improving system performance, reducing unsheltered homelessness, reducing criminalization. Inclusion in the local planning process of current and former homeless persons with lived experience; Partnerships with housing, health, and service agencies; Improving system performance; Placing an emphasis on anti-discrimination against LGBTQ+ individuals; and supporting local
