What?

An application from some of your neighbors has been submitted to the city proposing the creation of a Cleveland Knoll Historic District (see information about the application and historic districts on p. 2 and find a map and addresses on p. 3). This meeting is being held to provide owners and residents information about the application and historic districts in general. It will have two parts: 1) a Community Forum; and 2) a separate hearing conducted by the Historic Preservation Commission (HPC). If you are interested, you can attend in person or through the online broadcast (see p. 2).

Community Forum: City staff will provide an overview of the application and what it means to live and own property in historic districts, including how design review works, the steps involved in the designation process, and how you can express your support or opposition to the proposed district. We'll answer your questions and you'll be able to share your thoughts with neighbors and city representatives.

HPC Hearing: Immediately following the Community Forum, HPC will hold a hearing to analyze the application to see if the proposed area may be eligible for future designation. You will be able to offer written or oral testimony to express your views, which, along with what was heard during the forum, will inform the commission's determination. If determined eligible for future designation, HPC will authorize staff to proceed with obtaining a consultant to conduct a historic district survey, which will study the history of the neighborhood and look closely at each property. When it's ready, you'll receive more information about how to review the survey and information about your property. There will also be a second community forum and HPC hearing at which you'll again be able to share your thoughts about the survey findings or the overall district.

No final decisions about the proposed district will be made at this meeting – there are many steps before the final review by City Council (see flowchart on p. 4). Council cannot designate any district without the consent of the owners of over 50% of the area's properties.

Who? You've received this letter because you own and/or live in property in the proposed historic district or within 500 feet of the proposed boundary. There will be numerous opportunities for public input as the district designation process moves forward.

How to Get More Information

The application for the proposed Cleveland Knoll district contains a lot of information about the history of your neighborhood and why it may have significance in the development of Glendale. 

City of Glendale Historic District Designation Process

Historic District Application

Planning Department Review and Recommendation

Community Forum and HPC Hearing

Review and discussion of district application and historic districts in general. HPC may authorize staff to move forward with process. Notice sent to owners/resident in proposed area and within 500-foot radius.

RFP/Bidder Recommendation by Staff

City Council Authorization of Funding and Contract

Planning Department/Consultant Completes Draft Historic Resources Survey

Historic Preservation Commission Review and Recommendation of Survey and Community Forum

Notice and information sent to all owners and residents within proposed district

Petition

Proponents circulate petition requesting a historic district overlay zone (requires 50+% homeowner support w/in 6 months to proceed – may begin before public meeting)

Planning Commission Review and Final Recommendation

City Council Final Determination

Optional Petition

Council or HPC may require circulation of a petition to show amount of support in the neighborhood.

Optional Hearing

HPC may require another hearing if the draft survey needs substantial changes that require more review.
